Recycling Guidelines at a glance

What can and cannot go into your yellow bin



Materials accepted as recycling



Only clear and coloured plastics #1, #2 and #5 are recyclable. Plastic #1 meat trays are now accepted. All items need to be rinsed clean, with lids removed.

Clean **aluminium cans** and **steel tins** are recyclable. You need to rinse, clean, and check.



Cardboard and **paper** are recyclable. **Clean pizza boxes** (no food residue) are now accepted. Items must be larger than an envelope, clean and flattened.

The best way to improve our recycling system is following the three Rs model of reduce, reuse, and recycle

Materials not accepted as recycling



Plastics #3, #4, #6 and

#7 cannot be recycled, so keep them out of your yellow bin. Check what type of plastic things are when you buy and choose recyclable plastics.

- X Polystyrene
- X Coffee cups
- × Plastic bags
- K Garden waste
- X Clothing
- X Vaccum cleaner bags
- PPE (masks, gloves)
- X Cling wrap

Glass crate



You can only put **clean unbroken glass bottles** and **jars**, rinsed with lids removed in your glass crate.



Do not over fill your glass crate. Overfilled glass crates are a safety hazard.



You must ensure the **glass is level** with the top of the crate or it may not be picked up.

Extra bottles can be taken to the transfer station for **FREE** - Easy!
