Authority of Chairperson

The functions, powers and duties of the District Licensing Committee is delegated to the committee chairperson under section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 when no objection has been filed, and no matters of opposition have been raised by the Police, Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector in respect of the following applications:

- An application for a licence
- An application for a manager's certificate
- An application for renewal of a licence or manager's certificate

Decision

There have been no objections received in regards to this application and as such I am able to consider it on the papers put before me.

The applicant, Club Buller, is the holder of a current club licence and is seeking a special licence to allow the sale and supply of alcohol at a series of events at their premises 44 Queen Street Westport. A special licence is required as the events are open for non-club members or are outside of the current Club licenced hours.

The applicant has been granted previous special licences and there have been no adverse reports received from any of the events held.

The NZ Police and the Medical Officer of Health have no objections to the granting of this application and the Chief Licencing Inspector has provided a favourable report to this application. The Fire Service are not opposed to the granting of this application.

There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that the applicant is not suitable to be the holder of a special licence.

The events being held and the operating hours sought are as follows:

Seddon Shield Pool Tournament	02/09/16	3.00pm to midnight
	03/09/16	9.00am to midnight
Members All Blacks Breakfast	02/10/16	10.00am to 2.00pm
Mitre Ten Women's Triathlon	13/11/16	Midday to 3.00pm

The events will be held in the Club Buller premises which consist of a large room which can be divided by sliding doors. The area immediately adjacent to the bar will be used for the members All Black breakfast and the other two events will use the additional areas. Security cameras are located throughout the premises. A band will be playing throughout the Saturday evening of the Pool tournament.

A separate restaurant area is also located on the premises.

The premises are located in a residential area and while there are residential dwellings within close proximity it is not expected that the amenity or good order of the neighbourhood will be affected during the duration of the events. If there are any effects, then it is likely they will be of a minor nature and for a short duration.

The applicant has listed two suitably qualified nominated manager for the events. There will also be additional staff available. The manager and staff need to be well aware of their responsibilities under the Act and especially in ensuring that there are no sales to those under 18 years or to intoxicated persons. Staff will also need to ensure that no person under 18 years is being supplied alcohol unless it is by that person's parent or legal guardian.

Low and non-alcohol drinks will be available along with free water. Alternative transport options will be promoted by staff and signage and a phone will be available for patrons to use to organise alternative transport. Club members are entitled to use a discounted taxi service.

Food will be available from the restaurant and a cooked breakfast will be served at the members All Blacks breakfast with further snacks available at the half time break of the test match. Bar snacks will be available at all times.

The application appears to comply with the required criteria as set out under s.142 of the Act and I am satisfied that the sale and supply of alcohol will be undertaken responsibly and safely by the applicant.

I am also satisfied that any harm that may be caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol will be minimised by the actions of the applicant.

I therefore grant the application for a special licence from Club Buller subject to conditions.

Conditions to be imposed

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

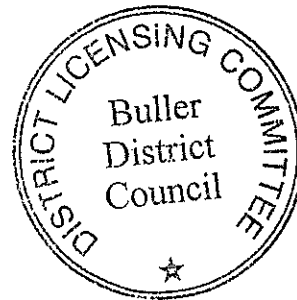
- (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied only on the following days and hours:

- (b) Free potable drinking water must be available for the duration of the licence
- (c) Alcohol may be sold in the following types of containers only: glass and plastic
- (d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
- Food must be available for consumption for the duration of the licence.
 - The licensee must have available for consumption, at all times when alcohol is being sold or supplied, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low alcohol refreshments.

- (iii) Transport options signage must be displayed. A phone must also be available on site to contact an alternative form of transport if required.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age.
 - (ii) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions. Any intoxicated persons may not enter or remain on the premises.
- (f) Designations as per Club Licence 54/CL/003/2016 apply, the Gaming Room is designated as Restricted.
- (g) The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act. The managers appointed for the purpose of this licence are to be Melanie Frances Gare and Yvonne Nancy Brace. A sign must be displayed identifying the duty manager.

WIAVER UNDER SECTION 208**

Decision

The Reefton Workingmens Club is seeking a waiver under s.208 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 as their application for a special licence for an event was not lodged 20 working days or more prior to the date of the event taking place.

The Reefton Workingmens Club is the holder of a current club licence and is looking to host a 'meet the candidates' evening on 27th September 2016. I wish it to be made known that I will be attending this event as I am a candidate in the local elections but I don't believe that this will in any unduly influence my decision on this application.

The District Licencing Committee has shown some leniency with the 20 working day requirement for special licence application to be lodged as possible applicants became familiar with this requirement since the new Act was introduced.

This period of leniency is not to be taken advantage of and those applicants that are current licence holders need to be aware that applications lodged within the 20 working day period places undue pressure on the agencies involved in the processing of these applications.

In granting this application I would recommend that the date for the reporting agencies reports to be completed and filed be Monday 22nd September 2016.

The District Licencing Committee has stated that eventually the applications lodged within the 20 working day requirement will be waived for applications related to holding a funeral but all other applications will need to show that there were exceptional circumstances that prevented the application from being lodged in the required time frame in order to be granted a waiver under s.208.

In this case the applicant has provided an email as evidence that the organisers of the evening had been late in confirming that Reefton Workingmens Club was to be the venue for this event and the application for a special licence was lodged as soon as this information was known.

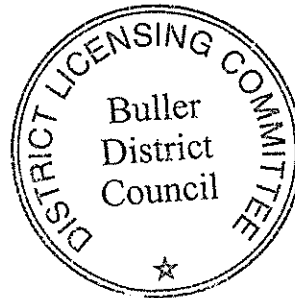
Given that these types of events only occur during the local body election cycle every 3 years and the leniency that the District Licencing Committee is presently showing then this application from Reefton Workingmens Club for a waiver under s.208 of the Act is granted.

It must be noted however that the applicant needs to be aware that the 20 working day requirement will need to be met in all but exceptional circumstances so potential users of this venue will need to be made aware of this requirement during their planning of future events.

The applicant is currently employed at the Criterion Hotel in Westport. During the time the applicant has been working at Criterion Hotel there was a controlled purchase operation carried out in which an underage volunteer was able to purchase alcohol. The applicant was not the seller but she was the nominated duty manager at the time and her managers certificate was suspended for 28 days from 18/04/16.


The applicant has the required relevant qualifications and has experience in managing on-licensed premises. The NZ Police have no objections to this application and there is a favourable report from the Chief Licencing Inspector. There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that Ms Collins is not a suitable person to hold a manager's certificate.

I am satisfied that the applicant appears to be able to manage on-licensed premises with the aim of contributing to the reduction of alcohol related harm by not selling alcohol to intoxicated persons or minors and ensuring that food and water is available at all times.

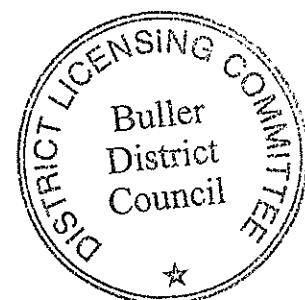

The NZ Police had no objections to this application but there is an unfavourable report from the Chief Licencing Inspector. There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that Ms Clarke is a suitable person to hold a manager's certificate given her lack of response to repeated written requests.

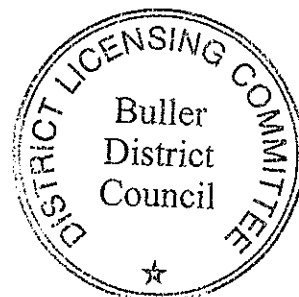
Decision

The applicant has the required relevant NZQA unit standards but has not provided a Licence Controller Qualification and no response has been received from follow up letters sent to the applicant by the Chief Licencing inspector.

The NZ Police had no objections to this application but there is an unfavourable report from the Chief Licencing Inspector due to lack of response. There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that Ms Ireland is a suitable person to hold a manager's certificate given her lack of response to repeated requests.

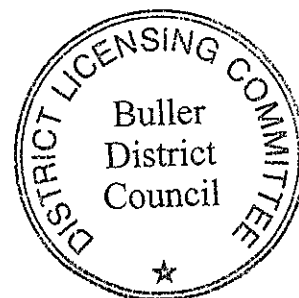
Decision

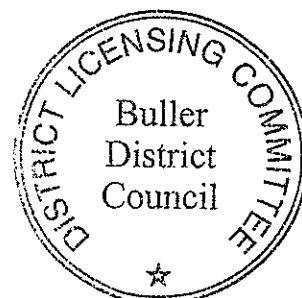

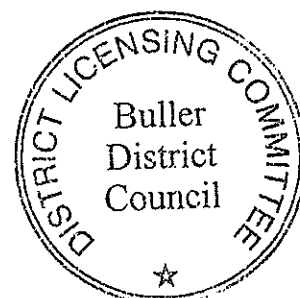

The applicant has the required relevant qualifications and has limited experience in managing club licenced premises only.

The NZ Police have no objections to this application and there is a favourable report from the Chief Licencing Inspector. There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that Mr Hateley is not a suitable person to hold a manager's certificate.

I am satisfied that the applicant appears to be able to manage club licenced premises with the aim of contributing to the reduction of alcohol related harm by not selling alcohol to intoxicated persons or minors and promoting food and low and non-alcohol beverages while making sure water is available to patrons.

The application appears to comply with the criteria required for the renewal of a manager's certificate as set out in s.227 of the Act and therefore I grant the application from Gerald David Hateley for renewal of his managers certificate on the understanding that his voluntary undertaking to only use this managers certificate in club licenced premises remains in place.

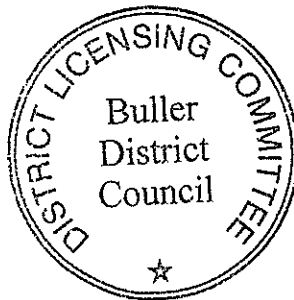

He checks ID's to prevent alcohol being sold to minors and makes food and water available to patrons.

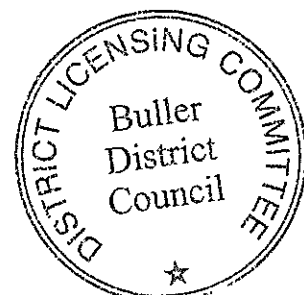

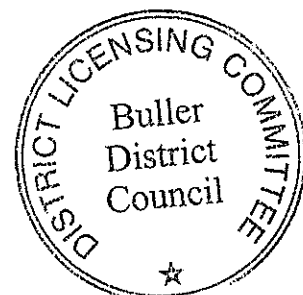

The functions, powers and duties of the District Licensing Committee is delegated to the committee chairperson under section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 where no objections have been filed, and no matters of opposition have been raised by the Police, Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector in respect of an application for a manager's certificate.

Summary and Evaluation of Evidence

There have been no objections received in regards to this application and as such I am able to consider it on the papers put before me. The applicant, Ian Douglas Ryder, is seeking renewal of his manager's certificate first granted in 1997 and has been renewed periodically since then.

The applicant is currently a joint shareholder and a director of the company holding the licence for the Punakaiki Tavern and is involved in the day to day operation of the Tavern. During the time the applicant has operated these premises there have been no adverse reports received about the management of these premises. The applicant has the required relevant qualifications and has considerable experience in managing licenced premises.


The NZ Police have no objections to this application and there is a favourable report from the Chief Licencing Inspector. There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that Mr Ryder is not a suitable person to hold a manager's certificate.

I am satisfied that the applicant appears to be able to manage licenced premises with the aim of contributing to the reduction of alcohol related harm by not selling alcohol to intoxicated persons or minors and promoting food and making sure water is available to patrons.

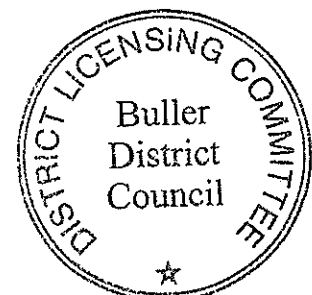
Decision

I am satisfied that the applicant appears to be able to manage on- licenced premises with the aim of contributing to the reduction of alcohol related harm by not selling alcohol to intoxicated persons or minors and promotes food to patrons.

The application appears to comply with the criteria required for the renewal of a manager's certificate as set out in s.227 of the Act and therefore I grant the application from Melanie Jane Ryder for renewal of her manager's certificate.
