The integration of Westport's stormwater system with the floodwalls is imperative. The current stormwater system (or lack thereof) is a regular cause of surface flooding. In my opinion this risk has increased because of a greater frequency of intense short duration rain events experienced. The housing development at Carters Beach since the inception of the current stormwater system has also increased the hard surface runoff and contributed to a lesser extent the flooding problems. I recommend that Carters Beach stormwater is improved by the installation of an increased network of stormwater pipes. I acknowledge the difficulty in engineering designs for low lying areas and the fact that older dwellings at Carters Beach were not designed with stormwater inundation mitigation. Specific Problem, Golf Links Rd. • Roadside sumps are inadequate to cope with medium to heavy rainfall events • No gutters exist for direction of water to controlled places • The road his higher than several of the properties. • No stormwater pipes exist for transport of water safely. • Inundation risk to my property is now frequent. The inability of roadside sumps to cope with rain events is also evident at other Carters Beach locations, including but not limited to the intersections of Cook St and Kupe Street, Cook Street and Tasman Street. Why bother with expensive, engineered flood walls at all if the basics such as stormwater are not functional?

Q12. Comments

I urge BDC to co-fund 40% (\$3.49 m) of the costs to upgrade Westport's stormwater network, in line with the construction of the floodwalls. This is a tiny percentage of the overall flood mitigation spend. Good stormwater management is fundamental to flood management. Stormwater needs to be constantly maintained and improved. I suggest WCRC and BDC looks at Nelson & Christchurch councils for developing stormwater strategies.

Option 1 is the sensible choice, we get \$5.27m from the government to help pay for work that has to happen anyway, and doing it now alongside the floodwalls is cheaper and safer than ripping things up later. It also means we own the pumps instead of scrambling to hire them every time it floods.

General endorsements: 1. The increased investment in Reefton's aged wastewater and drinking water pipes is sensible and should not be trimmed in later adjustments. 2. Drinking water reprofiling at Westport should be locked into a multi-year schedule with transparent reporting, so a timing adjustment now doesn't become a quiet deferral later. 3. Continued support for Resilient Westport and integration with stormwater works is the right direction. Reduced repairs and maintenance is a false economy: The plan openly acknowledges that the 2026/27 R&M reduction "increases the risk that the current infrastructure could fail sooner, and that repairs could cost more than proactively fixing it." Deferring maintenance to keep rates low today transfers a larger, more expensive bill to tomorrow's ratepayers, and in a district with Buller's hazard exposure and rateable-land constraints, that margin for error is already thin. I'd encourage Council to quantify the deferred maintenance backlog and report it openly each year, so the true cost of the 4.4% is visible. Inequitable scenarios / discouraging growth and development: Regarding Uniform Annual General Charge rates related to subdividing / vacant sections. I support increasing rates where needed however there are situations which possibly haven't been considered, are fairly inequitable and don't encourage growth and development. . My partner and I have subdivided our block at our address at [REDACTED] and have 7 sections all up; one has sold and one we live on. We're now paying targeted rates on all 6 sections (5 of them vacant with no dwellings or people living on them) for things like rubbish collection etc. Our latest rates charges for all 6 lots means we're paying over \$7,000.00 every year in rates. Council does not have a policy that discounts the uniform charges for these sorts of situations and it seems it would be sensible to do so. A general note: Buller doesn't win by being average. It wins by being specific. Beyond the annual plan mechanics, I want to register a bigger point. Buller's future isn't going to be shaped by trimming costs in any one year; it's going to be shaped by whether Council acts as the architect of a coherent operating system for the district. That means aligning identity, infrastructure decisions, risk management, and investment choices so they reinforce each other. Central government funding is increasingly criteria-driven (Regional Deals, Te Waihangā Priorities etc) and investment flows to places that can demonstrate alignment and delivery. The Westport Master Plan's Stage One endorsement and the \$22.9m Resilient Westport package show what's possible when Buller presents a credible, coordinated case. The annual plan is a tool for that architecture, not separate from it.

The upgrade of the Westport stormwater system is critical for long-term economic resilience, environmental and community wellbeing. Deferring the upgrade to post floodwall development creates an ongoing expenditure and maintenance lag, shifting the burden to future rate payers (when costs will be noticeably higher and funding potentially not supported by Government if the status quo was to remain). In addition, deferment poses greater risk to community safety and security and risks the integrity of the floodwalls to be built. Extreme weather events are increasingly becoming everyday occurrences and provision of key reliable infrastructure is but one (albeit critical) measure that council can oversee alongside existing and new measures led by council, business and community to enhance community resilience. Westport acts as a key commercial and service hub for Buller and the wider West Coast and the ability for those living remotely or in satellite towns, and those visiting, to access such services or facilities (with resilient infrastructure) ongoing for work, healthcare, recreation, cultural and social activities form a key part of individual and whānau social connection and economic wellbeing. It influences decisions to remain living here (or set down roots, or visit), take pride in and give back to the community. Westport and the district is not immune to effects from loss of jobs, inflation, worldwide conflict and financial downturns. It would be remiss to not consider all these factors when making expenditure decisions. The ongoing commercial, economic and environmental viability and prosperity of the district and the townships which Westport services relies on pragmatic decision making (including infrastructure development and maintenance) that at best in the most affordable, fair, staggered to avoid risk and financial strain and serves in both form and function in terms of priority. In such times where the transition to the new norm of climatic, environmental and economic upheaval will influence how and where we choose to live, how hazards will be accessed by insurers and how we will maintain prosperity and wellbeing, actively engaging and taking up opportunities that present themselves now to protect our future (and at the least cost at this point in time) is important. This must be done by bringing the community along, taking ownership of the outcomes, and delivering through transparency.

Storm water management is an important step in Flood Mitigation The Carters Beach Hall and amenities shed has issues with drainage which have been greatly exacerbated by West Reef compacting a large area in front of these buildings without putting drainage underneath. Accessing the mens toilet after rain is now a slippery accident waiting to happen. The back wall of the hall is also showing significant impact from pooling water.

Q12. Comments

Roading Local community often raise with us their concerns about the speeds at which people drive at Carters Beach. The roads at Carters Beach are a shared space with walkers, horses, golf buggies, children, cyclists, e-bikes and dogs. We continue to be surprised that there are speed restrictions at Birchfield, Waimangaroa, Granity etc but not at Carters Beach. We also raised this issue in our Reserve Management plan. Carters Beach requires new public toilets with disability access. The Carters Beach toilets are an example of aging infrastructure nearing or exceeding its useful life. The public toilets amenities block is heavily used by tourists, KCT users (5,000 in first month of opening), Reserve users and playground users. KCT estimate 170,000 thousand people have used the trail to date. The current Carters Beach toilet block does not comply with current code requirements for Public Toilets and does not comply with the code of compliance for disability access, or for accessible toilets. The roller door is dangerous, the roof gets leaks, and the toilet seats are plastic rather than robust and secure. The toilet walls are not an impervious surface, making cleaning difficult. There is no internal drain/plug hole when the toilets need hosed out. This is standard in bathroom wet areas. They are not able to be used by wheelchair users. Given the ever increasing public use of these toilets a plan needs to be made to upgrade, or rebuild completely, and at least one disability and/or accessible toilet needs to be added. They need to be safe, accessible and hygienic.

Subject: Changing the lease agreement between BDC and Buller Financial Mentoring Service Incorporated (BFMSI)

Summary Buller Financial Mentoring Service Incorporated (BFMSI) is a not-for-profit charitable trust. It has benefited from receiving community grants from BDC to cover the cost of renting two offices in the clocktower from BDC. As a result, BDC doesn't receive income from BFMSI. BFMSI would be significantly harmed financially if it failed to receive community grants to cover the cost of rent (\$9,052.52). So much so, that continuing to operate would be in doubt. With the community grant fund being reduced and therefore creating more competition for grants, BFMSI proposes the lease arrangement be changed to a 'peppercorn' rental arrangement as exists with some other community groups e.g. community garden on Brougham Street and Reefton Pony Club. Changing the lease agreement to a 'peppercorn' agreement would keep the cost to council neutral and in return BFMSI would not apply to BDC's community grants fund. The proposed change would also reduce administrative tasks and time associated with managing the current agreement. What we do Financial mentoring includes, but is not limited to:

- Gather and organise clients' financial information to establish their true financial situation before exploring options.
- Create tailored budget sheets, cashflows, debt repayment schedules.
- Negotiate debt repayment options.
- Advocacy e.g. to MSD, KiwiSaver providers (hardship withdrawals), creditors e.g. BDC (rates bills), banks, electricity providers.
- Ongoing review and mentoring for as long as clients want.

History Buller Budget Advisory Service Incorporated was formed in 1983 to address intergenerational deprivation and the economic status of the Buller community. In 2025, the organisation changed its name to Buller Financial Mentoring Service Incorporated. to better reflect the wide range of services offered.

Who we serve We provide a free service to anyone in Buller District who wishes to engage with us. Current clients Include: working people; double income families; retirees; people released from prison; beneficiaries; people who have recently been made redundant; people going through relationship separation.

Area of service All of Buller District. We travel all over the district to meet with clients if that is what they need or prefer.

Operations Two part-time staff are employed. One works 18 hours per week the other works 20 hours. Eight volunteers govern the organisation. Financial mentors are trained by Fincap. They understand consumer and lending laws which enables them to advocate and negotiate with creditors.

Partners We work closely with other agencies including Citizen's Advice Bureau, Te Ha o Kawatiri, Homebuilders, Age Concern, Buller REAP, St Vincent de Paul, IRD, MSD, Kawatiri Family Harm Prevention Network.

Numbers For year ending 30/06/25. Number of people clients registered is 560. 560×2.3 being the average number of people in a household in Buller = 1,288 people impacted. Client appointments $1,056 = 4$ per work day. Figures for the current financial year are already up on last year's.

The increase in the general diff rate for this project is .5%, resulting in an increase in my 2026/27 rates of \$36.38. The upgrade to the stormwater network ought to reduce all my insurance cover by more than this – good news in my books. I think improving the stormwater network will give us the best chance of having the insurance industry revisite our insurance costs. If some of the areas of Westport are left with flooding – this might be only surface flooding, we give the insurance industry a reason to say our flood defenses are inadequate and our insurance costs will remain high. I'm also really concerned that if the co-fund arrangement is not approved within the stated time frame – we will lose it. Later when the upgrade is deemed necessary by the new LWDW organisation, we will have to pay for the entire project – at a probably increased cost.
