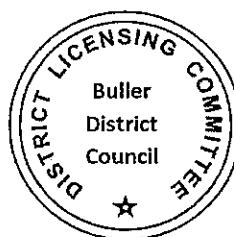

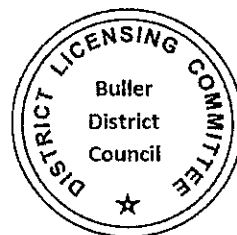

- d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol: (i) A Host Responsibility Policy must be maintained and displayed and all staff must receive training on responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. (ii) A range of food choices must be readily available at reasonable prices at all times that the premises are open. Menus must be visible and food actively promoted. (iii) A range of non and low alcoholic drinks must be readily available at reasonable prices. (iv) Information relating to safe transport options must be readily available to customers.
- e) Provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons must be observed: (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age; (ii) No sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons. Every point of sale must display appropriate signage detailing these restrictions.
- f) The following parts of the premises are designated as:
Undesignated: Foyer and Upstairs accommodation
Supervised: Bar and Outdoor Beer Garden
Restricted: Gaming Room
- g) Sections 56-57 of the Act requires the licence holder to display the following at each principal entrance to the premises so as to be easily read by persons immediately outside the entrance: (i) Signage stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; and (ii) A copy of the licence including conditions.

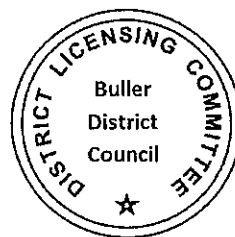

 - f) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of sales to intoxicated persons.
 - g) The following parts of the premises are designated as:

Application

This is an application by Westport RSA Inc (the licensee) for a Special Licence pursuant to Section 138 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 139 Palmerston Street, and known as Westport RSA Inc.

This application is to enable alcohol to be sold at the following occasions or events: Boxing Day and New Years Eve Events

The applicant seeks the following days and hours of operation: 26 December 2022 8:00pm till 1:00am the following day and 31 December 2022 8:00pm till 1:00am the following day.

The applicant has provided host responsibility and staffing details that demonstrate suitable measures are in place to ensure the responsible sale and supply of alcohol and that any potential opportunity for harm will be minimised.

The designation for the premises during the event is:

Undesignated:

Supervised: Any person under 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and as such the premises are deemed to be designated as supervised.

Restricted: The event is R18 therefore no persons allowed on the premises under the age of 18.

Reasons for the Decision

- The Licensing Inspector has provided a favourable report and has raised no opposition. The Inspector has also indicated that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.
- The NZ Police has raised no matters in opposition to this application.
- The Medical Officer of Health has raised no matters in opposition to this application.
- The application was not required to be publicly notified.
- The applicant has demonstrated that the manner in which they sell, supply, display and promote alcohol complies with the Act.
- The applicant has previously been granted special licences for events and there have been no adverse reports received.

- There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate the applicant is not suitable to be the holder of a licence.

In summary, the application and supporting information satisfies all the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.

Decision

I have considered all the papers put before me and I am satisfied that the application meets all the requirements of the criteria of s.142 of the Act and the applicant will be able to safely and responsibly supply and sell alcohol in a manner that will ensure that any harm caused by the inappropriate or excessive consumption of alcohol will be minimised.

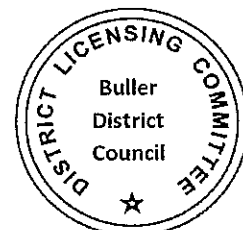
I therefore grant the application by Westport RSA Inc. (the licensee) and authorise the issue of a special licence subject to the terms and conditions noted below as forming part of this decision.

The licence may issue immediately.

Conditions to be imposed:

- (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied only on the following days and hours:
26 December 2022 8:00pm till 1:00am the following day and 31 December 2022 8:00pm till 1:00am the following day.
- (b) Free potable drinking water must be available on the premises for the duration of the licence.
- (c) Alcohol may be sold in the following types of containers only: Glasswear and Bottles.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - (i) Food must be available at reasonable prices for consumption for the duration of the event.
 - (ii) The licensee must have available for consumption, at all times when alcohol is being sold or supplied, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low alcohol refreshments.
 - (iii) Transport options signage must be displayed. A phone must also be available on site to contact an alternative form of transport if required.
 - (iv) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age.
 - (ii) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
 - (iii) Any intoxicated persons may not enter or remain on the premises.
- (e) A copy of the licence and conditions must be displayed in a prominent place so as to be easily read by persons entering through the principal entrances.
- (f) The following parts of the premises are designated as:
Supervised: Dining and Dance Floor, pool tables and bar seating areas Any person under 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and as such the premises are deemed to be designated as supervised.
Restricted: Bar, chiller and club storage/office/library rooms.
- (g) The managers appointed for the purpose of this licence are to be Fiona Hutchinson and Yvonne Brace. A sign must be displayed identifying the duty manager.

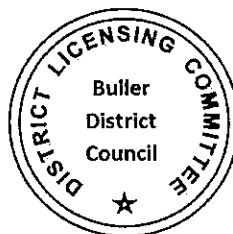

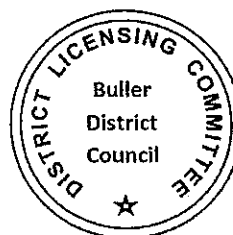

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, therefore grants the application for a new Club Licence for Karamea Bowling Club for the premises known as Karamea Bowling Club situated at 36 Waverley St, Karamea and authorises the issue of a new Club Licence.

The licence may be issued on receipt of the annual fee payable as per Section 15, Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

S 15 Time when annual fees are payable for new licences


- *If a new on-licence, off-licence, or club licence is applied for and issued after the commencement of these regulations,—*

- (a) the annual fee for the licence must be paid before the licence is issued; and
- (b) subsequently, the annual fee for the licence must be paid on the anniversary of the date on which the licence was issued.

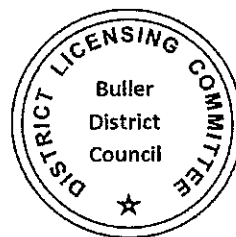
The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The holder of a club licence must take all practicable steps to ensure that: (i) there is at all times a secretary of the club; and (ii) within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club must inform the secretary of the District Licensing Committee of the name of the new secretary; and (iii) all proceeds from the sale of alcohol belong to the club.
- (b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours: Wednesdays 6.00pm till 10:00pm, Saturday and Sunday 9:00am till 10:00pm, 24th January 2023 9:00am till 5:00pm.
- (c) Drinking water must be freely available within the licensed areas while the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol: (i) A Host Responsibility Policy must be maintained and displayed and all staff must receive training on responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. (ii) A range of food choices must be readily available at reasonable prices at all times that the premises are open. Menus must be visible and food actively promoted. (iii) A range of non and low alcoholic drinks must be readily available at reasonable prices. (iv) Information relating to safe transport options must be readily available to customers.
- (e) Provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons must be observed: (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age; (ii) No sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons. Every point of sale must display appropriate signage detailing these restrictions.
- (f) The following parts of the premises are designated as:
Undesignated: The Entire Premises
- (g) Sections 56-57 of the Act requires the licence holder to display the following at each principal entrance to the premises so as to be easily read by persons immediately outside the entrance: (i) Signage stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; and (ii) A copy of the licence including conditions.
- (h) Section 214(3) of the Act requires signage to be displayed inside the premises which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty. For Club Licences, Section 215 may also be applied.
