## on the West Coast

### We want to hear from people living on the West Coast about their thoughts and current ways of dealing with food and green waste.

### Why does your opinion matter?

The information gathered through this survey will help your district council to:

- Understand how urban communities currently dispose of food and garden waste.
- Understand urban communities preferences regarding food and garden waste collection.
- Scope out options for food and garden waste collection and processing on the West Coast.

### What is food waste?

Food waste includes scraps and waste food, including fruits and vegetables and their skins/peels (e.g., avocado stones and corn cobs), but also grains, meat, fish, cooked foods, takeaways, processed foods, dairy, bones, shells, shellfish.

### What is green waste?

Green waste includes lawn clippings, weeds, leaves, flowers, and small branches.

### Why a survey?

The Ministry for the Environment requires all district and city councils to provide food scraps (or food and garden waste) collection for households in urban areas of over 1,000 people by 1 January 2030. This will apply to Westport, Reefton, Greymouth, Runanga, and Hokitika.

Currently food scraps and wasted food are disposed of with general household rubbish. This rubbish is transported to landfills for disposal, creating emissions and high costs for ratepayers.

The three West Coast District Councils (Buller, Grey and Westland) are working with the Ministry for the Environment and Development West Coast to find practical solutions reducing the amount of food waste that ends up in landfills.
