 - (ii) The licensee must have available for consumption, at all times when alcohol is being sold or supplied, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low alcohol refreshments.
 - (iii) Transport options signage must be displayed. A phone must also be available on site to contact an alternative form of transport if required.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age.
 - (ii) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
 - (iii) Any intoxicated persons may not enter or remain on the premises.
- (f) A copy of the licence and conditions must be displayed in a prominent place so as to be easily read by persons entering through the principal entrances.
- (g) The following parts of the premises are designated as:
Undesignated: Main Hall, Outside Verandah and Tent areas.

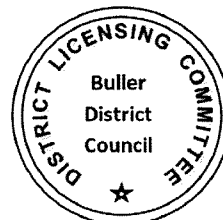

The functions, powers and duties of the District Licensing Committee is delegated to the committee chairperson under section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 when no objection has been filed, and no matters of opposition have been raised by the Police, Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector in respect of an application for a licence.

The meeting to hear this application commenced with a committee of one hearing the application.

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of a On Licence.

The evidence before for consideration is the application and reports from the Licensing Inspector, the Police and the West Coast Medical Officer of Health.

There have been no objections to this application following the correct publication and displaying of the required public notices and as such I have determined not to hold a public hearing to determine this application and I will be considering the application on the papers presented to me.

Decision

1. The applicant has suitable experience, qualified staff and has detailed sufficient required information on the pertinent Regulations form of application.
2. The NZ Police have raised no matters in opposition to this application.
3. The Medical Officer of Health has raised no matters in opposition to this application.
4. The Licensing Inspector has provided a favourable report and raised no opposition.
5. There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate the applicant is not suitable to be the holder of a licence.
6. The application and supporting information satisfies all the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 (Renewal) of the Act.

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, therefore grants the application for a renewal of On-Licence for The Lyric Theatre Granity, Incorporated Society for the premises known as The Lyric Theatre situated at 92 Torea St, Granity and authorises the issue of a renewal of On-Licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- a) No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not: (i) residing or lodging on the premises; or (ii) present on the premises to dine.
- b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours to any person: Monday to Sunday 11:00am - 12:00am Midnight (scheduled events)
- c) Drinking water must be freely available within the licensed areas while the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
- d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol: (i) A Host Responsibility Policy must be maintained and displayed and all staff must receive training on responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. (ii) A range of food choices must be readily available at reasonable prices at all times that the premises are open. Menus must be visible and food actively promoted. (iii) A range of non and low alcoholic drinks must be readily available at reasonable prices. (iv) Information relating to safe transport options must be readily available to customers.
- e) Provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons must be observed: (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age; (ii) No sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons. Every point of sale must display appropriate signage detailing these restrictions.
- f) The following parts of the premises are designated as:
Undesignated: Auditorium, Stage, Foyer, Toilets and Outside Area
Supervised: Mezzanine Floor, Stairwell, Kitchen/Servery, Ticketing Office, Back Stage and Dressing Rooms.
- g) Sections 56-57 of the Act requires the licence holder to display the following at each principal entrance to the premises so as to be easily read by persons immediately outside the entrance: (i) Signage stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; and (ii) A copy of the licence including conditions.
- h) Section 214(3) of the Act requires signage to be displayed inside the premises which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.

Authority of Chairperson

The functions, powers and duties of the District Licensing Committee is delegated to the committee chairperson under section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) when no objection has been filed, and no matters of opposition have been raised by the Police, Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector in respect of an application for a licence.

Decision

Club Buller Incorporated is applying for a special licence to allow for the sale and supply of alcohol on 06 August 2025 at a funeral/reception for Edna Morgan which will allow non-members of the Club to be served alcohol. The applicant is seeking operating hours of 4:00pm till 8:00pm.

The applicant is the holder of a current Club licence and has been granted special licences on a number of occasions. There have been no adverse reports received about any of these events. There is also nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that the applicant is not suitable to be the holder of a special licence.

West Coast Police and Medical Officer of Health have mutually agreed in principle to not raise any matters in opposition to the granting of applications for special licences for a funeral or funeral reception when it is to be held at a Workingmens Club or RSA. As such I am able to consider the application on the papers put before me.

A club only requires a special licence for these events to allow persons who are not members of the Club to be able to purchase and consume alcohol and it is acknowledged that it is likely that the deceased person, or the family of that person, are members of the Club and that any other persons are attending as their guests.

Low and non-alcoholic drinks and free drinking water will be available on the premises. Catering will be provided by the Club.

The layout of the premises will not materially alter during the holding of this event and therefore the design and layout of the premises is considered adequate and given the short duration of the event it is not expected that the amenity or good order of the neighbourhood will be affected in more than a minor way.

The applicant has nominated Evan Fox, Kerera Corbett-Manga and Samantha Rolton as managers for the event and they are the holders of current manager's certificates. All other staff are aware of their responsibilities to monitor patron's behaviour and ensure that the requirements of the Act are being met. All staff will ensure that ID is requested from those who look under 25

years of age and no alcohol will be sold to minors or to intoxicated persons. Intoxicated patrons will not be allowed to remain on the premises and disorderly behaviour will not be tolerated.

I am satisfied that the application meets the required criteria as set out in s.142 of the Act and that the applicant will ensure that the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol will be undertaken safely and responsibly and that any harm that may be caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol will be minimised. Therefore, this application from Club Buller Incorporated for a special licence is granted subject to conditions.

As applications for special licences for funerals/funeral receptions are unable to be made within the required 20 working day timeframe under the Act, a waiver under section 208 of the Act is hereby also granted.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied only on the following days and hours:
Saturday 6th September 2025 4:00pm till 8:00pm
- (b) Free potable drinking must be available for the duration of the licence on request from the bar, or by way of self service from jugs on the bar.
- (c) Alcohol may be sold in the following types of containers only: Glass vessels, cans.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - (i) Food must be available for consumption for the duration of the licence.
 - (ii) The licensee must have available for consumption, at all times when alcohol is being sold or supplied, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low alcohol refreshments.
 - (iii) Transport options signage must be displayed. A phone must also be available on site to contact an alternative form of transport if required. Courtesy transport is also to be available.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age.
 - (ii) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
 - (iii) Any intoxicated persons may not enter or remain on the premises.
- (f) The designations of the existing Club Licence apply.
- (g) The qualified managers appointed for the purpose of this licence are to be Evan Fox, Kerera Corbett-Manga and Samantha Rolton. A sign must be displayed identifying the duty managers.
- (h) A certified manager must be onsite for the entire duration of the Special licenced event.
