- 2. Ensuring that all functions and powers required of a local authority under legislation, and all decisions required by legislation to be made by local authority resolution, are carried out effectively and efficiently, either by the Council or through delegation.


#### **Terms of Reference**

- 1. To exercise those powers and responsibilities which cannot legally be delegated by Council:
  - a) The power to set district rates.
  - b) The power to create, adopt and implement a bylaw.
  - c) The power to borrow money, or purchase or dispose of assets, other than in accordance with the Long Term Plan.
  - d) The power to adopt a Long Term Plan or Annual Plan, or Annual Report.
  - e) The power to appoint a Chief Executive Officer.
  - f) The power to adopt policies required to be adopted and consulted on under the Local Government Act 2002 in association with the Long Term Plan, or developed for the purpose of the Council's governance statement, including the Infrastructure Strategy.
  - g) The power to adopt a remuneration and employment policy for Chief Executive Officer.
  - h) The power to approve or change the District Plan, or any part of that Plan, in accordance with the Resource Management Act 1991.
  - i) The power to approve or amend the Council's Standing Orders.
  - j) The power to approve or amend the Code of Conduct for Elected Members.
  - k) The power to appoint and discharge members of committees.
  - I) The power to establish a joint committee with another local authority of other public body.
  - m) The power to make the final decision on a recommendation from the Parliamentary Ombudsman, where it is proposed that Council not accept the recommendation.
  - n) Health & Safety obligations and legislative requirements are met.

- 2. To exercise the following powers and responsibilities of Council, which the Council chooses to retain:
  - a) Resolutions required to be made by a local authority under the Local Electoral Act 2001, including the appointment of an electoral officer and reviewing representation arrangements.
  - b) Approval of any changes to Council's vision, and oversight of that vision by providing direction on strategic priorities and receiving regular reports on its overall achievement.
  - c) Adoption of governance level strategies, plans and policies which advance Council's vision and strategic goals.
  - d) Approval of the Triennial Agreement.
  - e) Approval of the local governance statement required under the Local Government Act 2002.
  - f) Approval of a proposal to the Remuneration Authority for the remuneration of Members.
  - g) Approval of any changes to the nature and delegations of the Committees.
  - h) Approval of funding to benefit the social, cultural, arts and environmental wellbeing of communities in Buller District
  - i) Ensuring Buller is performing to the highest standard in the area of civil defence and emergency management through:
    - i) Implementation of Government requirements
    - ii) Contractual service delivery arrangements with the West Coast Regional Group Emergency Management Office
  - j) All other powers and responsibilities not specifically delegated to the Risk and Audit Committee, subcommittees, independent hearing panels or Inangahua Community Board.

# Draft Long-Term Plan 2025-2034 Hearings, Deliberations and Decisions Report

- EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
   The purpose of this report is to hear submissions on the Draft Long-Term Plan (LTP) 2025-2034.
- 2. This issue arises from the requirements of s83(1)(d) and (e), and s 93(2) of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA).
- 3. This report recommends that Council hear, and consider the submissions to the Draft Long Term Plan 2025 – 2034, use these submissions to make decisions about the content of the Long-Term Plan 2025 – 2034 and direct the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to make any necessary amendments, ready for the adoption of the final Long-Term Plan 2025 – 2034 on 30 June 2025.

# 4. **DRAFT RECOMMENDATION**

That Council...

1. Receives the report and the attachments.

- 2. Hear and consider the written and verbal submissions.
- 3. Deliberates on the submissions to the draft Long-Term Plan once the hearings are complete.
- 4. Instructs the Chief Executive Officer to make the necessary amendments to the Draft Long Term Plan 2025-2034 based on the outcome of the deliberations and present the Final Long-Term Plan and supporting documents to the Extraordinary Council Meeting on 30 June 2025 for adoption.

#### 5. **ISSUES & DISCUSSION**

#### 6. BACKGROUND

- 7. At the Extraordinary Council meeting on 23 April 2025, Council agreed to conduct public consultation under s 93(2) LGA by adopting the draft LTP 2025 2034 and Consultation Document. The consultation document was audited by EY New Zealand and met the requirements of s 93C.
- 8. The public were asked to consider one key consultation topic:

# 13. CONSIDERATIONS

# 14. Strategic Impact

The Long-Term Plan (LTP) is the key strategic document that guides a council's decisions over a 10-year period (in this instance 9 years). It outlines priorities, funding strategies, and long-term goals, ensuring efficient resource allocation. The LTP provides a financial framework, forecasting expenditure and investment while maintaining fiscal responsibility. It also enhances transparency, allowing the community to track progress and assess delivery.

#### 15. Significance Assessment

The significance and engagement policy sets out the criteria and the framework for a matter or transaction to be deemed significant. The Draft LTP and associated Consultation Document are significant and due process around consultation must be undertaken.

- 16. The level of significance has been assessed as being high under Council's Significance and Engagement Policy
- 17. Public consultation was undertaken under s 93(2) from Friday, 25 April 2025 and closed on Monday, 26 May 2025 at 4.30pm. This was advertised through public notices in local newspapers, public drop-in sessions throughout the district, and through the Council's other communication channels.

# 18. Risk Management Implications / Opportunities

The following risks or opportunities are identified with the issues identified in this report:

 Compliance and regulatory risk – Delaying or not holding the hearing risks adopting the draft LTP 2025 – 2034 outside of the legislative timeframe. This can be mitigated by holding the hearing and making decisions to finalise the draft LTP 2025 - 2034.

- Reputational risk If the Council does not hold the hearing there is a risk of damage to its reputation as the public will perceive that Council does not take their views into account in making decisions. This can be mitigated by holding the hearing and elected members upholding s 82(e) LGA, receiving views with an open mind and given due consideration in making decisions.
- Financial Significant changes to the draft LTP 2025 2034 could result in an unbalanced budget. The Council's budgeting process has identified areas where funding can be reduced, further reductions are likely to cause a higher rate increase in the future.

# 19. Policy & Legislative Considerations

The local Government Act 2002 governs the activities of Buller District Council and sets out the requirement for consulting and the adoption of the LTP. This report assists with two key purposes of that Act (located in section 3) stating the purpose of the act is to promote the accountability of local authorities to their communities and provide for local authorities to play a broad role in meeting the current and future needs of their communities for good-quality local infrastructure, local public services, and performance of regulatory functions

The Seddonville campground needs to be painted as a whole, if this is not done the building will suffer structural damage. We had a quote of \$60,7020.00 (Inc GST) to paint the building in its entirety, we were sucsessful in our aplication to the Buller resilience Trust for funding to paint the exterior (\$31,395.00), this is currently being done. This leaves a balance of \$29,325.00 (inc GST) to paint the interior. Being a BDC asset, volunteered by a community group, for the community, it is only fair that this cost sits with BDC.

The Trust has annual costs of approximately \$121,500 to operate the Museum and its site. The actual expenditure of 2024-2025 is attached. It also contains the Budget for 2025-2026. It is a portion of the all. But notability we have 2 additional new projects to incorporated into our requests. One being the taking over of the entire KiwiRail Lease of Granity (\$5,000) and (\$800) for the annual costs of MYOB. We have highlighted the operating costs that amount to the 38020 requested.

#### Q16. How will this funding benefit the wider community?

Re the mowing and beautification .. all the community want this done. (The NBCS has folded) The community will take pride in the new (Museum lead) group with the support of resources via the Museum Trust. The Museum and site have grown significantly, and we have gained more volunteers. The Museum supports and enhances the community's knowledge of its history, importance of the area they live in, and this gives strength and connection to its past. This helps with community resilience and the need for security and wellbeing for its future as the Museum and site grow. The Museum supports other organizations within the area and supplies a diverse range of assistance. We also provide a great deal of employment for Contractors and Heritage Businesses both locally (where can) and all over the South Island. We provide a space for schools to visit, the community to learn from, open for Community meetings, volunteers share their experiences, and the Museum participates with learning how to restore and preserve historic exhibits alongside them. We supply room for park overs, markets and events where needed. The Museum offers friendship and works with the local business operators with good interaction for mutual benefit. We are also developing a community workshop space and gardening group once current projects are nearing completion. We gained a KPI of over 8,000 this year and we have regular families and individuals (from the North Island) that return each year and will work on restoration projects with us. Heritage groups visit regularly.

Promoting Buller Incorporated (PBI) was formed in 2024 and last year our group was successful in obtaining \$10000 from BDC to help support PBI in developing a Buller Identity Kit. Once completed the Identity Kit will guide future promotional efforts in attracting people to come visit, live and play in the Buller. The vision of PBI is to champion the future of the Buller District by advancing the visitor economy through adaptive leadership and collaboration. We promote and celebrate the diversity of the district from Punakaiki in the South to Karamea in the North, including the main towns of Westport and Reefton, and the many other diverse communities within the district boundaries. PBI have almost completed the initial draft of the Buller Identity Kit (this will be a living document). Once completed we then plan to develop a Buller website that will act as a central information hub, linking to existing community media platforms (e.g., Reefton, Karamea, Punakaiki, Westport NZ) and that will also connect to DWC's regional West Coast NZ website. The group are requesting \$10000 from the LTP to help us continue on with this promotional work. We hope to run a winter snaps competition similar to the hugely successful summer snaps competition and will run a summer promotion yet to be decided. We need administrative support for these promotional projects and to manage ongoing social media platforms such as facebook and instagram.

We are a group of multi-skilled, community driven volunteers, and by financially supporting our group the return in value will be far greater than the \$10000 invested. To date, PBI has secured \$51,400 in external funding (BRT) and our group remains committed to pursuing additional funding sources to support our mission. Promoting Buller is not just about attracting visitors —it's about celebrating who we are, understanding our strengths, and ensuring our communities thrive while preserving our distinct identity. Upgrade Heating: The wall heaters installed above the curtain rails along the hall walls have been in place for a rather long time and have become less and less efficient. Ideally these would be replaced with heaters of much higher efficiency both in terms of power use and effectiveness. This would enhance the user experience as well as provide a healthier environment for hall users especially in Winter. Mobile Staging: There are a number of occasions when a stage platform would provide better access for hall users to the focus of an event, whether it be a bridal party, a safety briefing, a kapa haka performance or a band, a stage gives everyone both a visual and an auditory aid to hall activities. I would like to be able to purchase a mobile stage configuration that could be used both inside and outside and could be both mobile and stored conveniently. Solar panel installation: Because the hall is also a civil defence hub, It houses all the equipment necessary to facilitate community communications if a major event occurs. We currently do not own a generator or any source of power other than one solar panel which would not connect to hall services. Ideally if solar panels were installed we could provide a much safer warmer environment even as we give cups of tea and information.

Self evidently being in a warm space is better for health and building longevity. Solar panels would diminish power costs and provide some electricity security in the event of an emergency. A stage is a fundamental requirement for many activities and an enhancement for many others.

## Q15. Please provide a brief description outlining the purpose of the funding or the project it should support.

This request seeks one-off support of \$47,000 to ensure the Kawatiri Coastal Trail meets core operational, compliance, and reporting requirements. It includes external audit (required for sign-off of Provincial Growth Fund funding), development of a Communications Strategy, health & amp; safety compliance, user data collection, and digital systems for recordkeeping and governance. These items are all critical for day-to-day operations and are required for the Trail's pending application to become the New Zealand Cycle Trails next Great Ride. Now that the \$9.5mill construction phase is complete, this funding is essential to transition the Kawatiri Coastal Trail into a longterm and sustainable operation; co funding will demonstrate regional backing needed to attract national co-funders including but not limited to New Zealand Cycle Trails (who could offer up to \$85,000 per year if the KCT is approved as a Great Ride), sponsors and confidence in the local community to invest in enhancing accommodation and dining facilities.

#### Q16. How will this funding benefit the wider community?

This investment protects and enhances a \$9.5 million a nationally significant and Buller community asset that has already recorded over 16,000 uses in 2025. The business case for the trail (ref Martin Jenkins Business Case Appendix 2) states the trail is projected to deliver \$79 mill in visitor spending in the Buller District by 2031. The trail not only supports visitor growth, improves safety and transparency, and strengthens Buller's ability to attract external investment and co-funding. The communications and data collection tools will drive increased trail use and enable better planning across trail user experiences, health, tourism, and infrastructure. Every dollar of Council support helps unlock regional and national ROI — including NZCT funding — and ensures that the Trail continues to deliver measurable economic, social, and environmental benefits across the district

## Q15. Please provide a brief description outlining the purpose of the funding or the project it should support.

We are requesting \$30,000 per year for three years to support the Kawatiri Coastal Trail's Trail Manager position and core maintenance programme. The Trail Manager is responsible for overseeing daily operations, ensuring safety standards, coordinating volunteers, managing marketing, engaging with the community, and maintaining stakeholder relationships. The maintenance fund supports critical upkeep such as signage, weed control, mowing, and structural inspections. This funding is crucial for transitioning from short-term seed funding to long-term sustainability and will demonstrate regional backing needed to attract national co-funders including but not limited to New Zealand Cycle Trails, who we understand could contribute up to \$85,000 per year if the KCT is approved as a Great Ride.

### Q16. How will this funding benefit the wider community?

With over 16,000 recorded uses (Cycling and pedestrian) at the Westport end so far this year, the KCT supports health, recreation, education, tourism, and low-emissions transport, and is projected to contribute \$79M+ to the Buller economy by 2031. This funding will help preserve the trail's quality, support local jobs, enrich the local community and ensure reliable operations. Demonstrating financial resilience is a key requirement for attaining Great Ride status. Even staged or partial support from Council will be viewed positively and is consistent with the approach taken in other regions across New Zealand. Council investment signals local commitment, strengthens the Trail's application, and positions Buller as a national leader in cycling infrastructure and regenerative, nature-based tourism.

#### Q15. Please provide a brief description outlining the purpose of the funding or the project it should support.

In 2018 Kaitiaki Mokihinui (KMCT) was granted \$30,000 via a submission to Buller's LTP (2018) to help kickstart funding accumulation to build a swingbridge over Chasm Creek at the Chasm Creek Walkway, Seddonville. The bridge was completed in 2025, and opened last December. In order to provide full access to the walkway we need access over the other large creek, Pages Stream, restored. The old railway bridge over Pages Stream may still be in good enough condition to get repaired, but if not then another swingbridge will be required. We have spoken with Adams Construction, Westport, about getting an assessment of the cost of repair, hoping we could provide a financial costing to this LTP but unfortunately, even though we first approached Adams at the dawn of 2025, and as previous experiences confirm, such requests can take a long time to happen and so we can now only estimate based on previous experience. Naturally we would need to go for the cheaper option (repair versus new build) as capital funding is very hard to raise, and as a very rough round figure our swingbridge cost around \$200,000 all up so we would not expect access over Pages Stream to exceed this amount (excluding inflation), especially as working on Chasm Bridge was the more challenging project due to the terrain.

#### Q16. How will this funding benefit the wider community?

Our trust has been thrilled to see the increased popularity of the Chasm Creek Walkway with the new swingbridge installed, and we have received many appreciative comments on the swingbridge and its provision of increased accessibility. There is an obvious appreciation of the walkway access and throughput by bikers off the 'Old Ghost Road'. The swingbridge itself is admired as a structure standing on its own merit, including the views it engenders. Importantly it provides through access to the outside world and takes people and their bikes off the dangerous winding road over the chasm. However, if access over Pages Stream was reinstated it would get people and their bikes completely off that winding chasm road. It would be good for local business (out hotel) as, instead of only accessing the walkway from the western end, a through-and-return walk can likely lead to refreshments at the hotel. And for other businesses in the wider area, instead of telling their clients of our beautiful walkway only being partly accessible it could instead be recommended in its full glory. Although the eastern end of the walkway may not be so scenic indigenous restoration is well-advanced making it a very pleasant trip through indigenous shrubbery, with views to our ranges and Mt Glasgow. We have noticed that myriad older folk like our walkway due to its qualities packed into its short, 1km length, and full access would be beneficial to them. Attending to Pages Bridge would also be advantageous from a historical viewpoint. Chasm Creek Walkway is an important asset to our remote(ish) community, and for the community's wellbeing the walkway needs to be fully open.

#### Q15. Please provide a brief description outlining the purpose of the funding or the project it should support.

This request is to reinstate the annual funding that existed in the previous LTP to support operation and maintenance of The Old Ghost Road (www.oldghostroad.org.nz) – a significant community-led asset. The quantum of this funding was \$30,000 per annum. This funding is critical to the financial health and viability of The Old Ghost Road and is used to leverage further external investment that requires a local co-funding component. The impact of this funding loss is therefore greater than Council's contribution alone. When provided, the funding supported trail operation and maintenance activities and was entirely reinvested in the Buller district as labour and materials. When the local economic multiplier effect by spending locally of 2 to 2.5 is taken into account, the direct economic return on investment of the annual grant is likely to be 4 to 5 times the grant value, ensuring an excellent outcome for ratepayers and Council

#### Q16. How will this funding benefit the wider community?

This funding will support the on-going viability and productivity of The Old Ghost Road and deliver on all the Community Outcomes identified as important by Council. These include: • Social – The Old Ghost Road engenders positive attitudes and responses from visitors and in-turn contributes to a sense of pride and evolving identity for the district about our amazing

outdoors and as rewarding and vibrant place to visit and live. • Affordability - the operating approach and model of a small, agile, and responsive Charitable Trust delivers highly efficient and productive outcomes and therefore results in an excellent return on investment. • Prosperity - the very existence of The Old Ghost Road was designed to contribute to district vibrancy and prosperity by diversifying our economy via sustainable growth and creating employment and business opportunities for supporting products and services. Economic data validates this. Additional initiatives that create new, regenerative opportunities for the Buller district are underway (environmental and educational tourism - see here for an example of a recent pilot programme developed by the Mokihinui-Lyell Backcountry Trust). • Culture - The Old Ghost Road and its annual fundraising event - the Old Ghost Ultra - contribute strongly to community cohesion, spirit, and sense of who we are. This is perhaps best evidenced in a short documentary (Spirit of the West) that is currently under embargo but should be available by the time this request is considered. • Environment - a significant portion of Old Ghost Road users report being positively influenced in relation to better connecting, understanding, and wishing to support the environment. The Old Ghost Road proactively (discretionarily) maintains a large predator trap network throughout the trail with many notable flow on effects. The Mökihinui-Lyell Backcountry Trust is progressing a concept to grow the local nature economy by way of a landscape scale predator free sanctuary that would, if implemented, bring significant social, environmental, and economic benefits. Rationale and Supporting Context for this Request The Old Ghost Road is maintained and operated by the Mökihinui-Lyell Backcountry Trust, a registered Charitable (not-for-profit) Trust. The Mokihinui-Lyell Backcountry Trust has had to significantly expand its operations and activities to generate and diversify income streams required to operate and maintain the facility. It does this via the operation of a tourism business (the Rough and Tumble Bush Lodge in Seddonville) and organisation and delivery of an annual fundraising event (the Old Ghost Ultra), meaning the Trust has gone to considerable lengths to meet its needs, rather than just relying on external financial support. The Old Ghost Road has achieved national and growing international acclaim, awards, and designations as a bucket-list experience and it is officially a 'Great Ride' of New Zealand. The Old Ghost Road: • Enjoys almost 6,000 overnight users per annum; • Has an annual average user satisfaction rating of 9.6 out of 10 (and a Net Promoter Score of 93); • Sees 92% of trail visitors coming to the Buller district solely because of the trail (i.e. is a major destination driver); • Sees each visitor spending an average of \$680 on and during their trip; • Generates an estimated \$5M-\$6M annually in terms of direct and indirect economic benefit; • Positively influences visitors' perceptions of the Buller district as a place to visit and live; • Positively influences peoples' understanding, attitudes, and motivations about our communities, nature, and their desire to contribute and look after them; and • Voluntarily (discretionarily) administers more than 1.000 predator traps throughout the trail, contributing to the survival and health of native species, in turn contributing to ecosystem integrity and well-being. Despite these outcomes, systemic issues mean that not enough of the substantial community benefits delivered by trails such as The Old Ghost Road are retained by the entities responsible for operating and maintaining them, meaning financial survival is tenuous and often risks undermining the enormous benefits trails deliver. As one of 23 Great Rides in New Zealand, a 2024 survey indicated that The Old Ghost Road received the equal lowest Council contribution (as a percentage of its operating costs) of any Great Ride in New Zealand (notably, the contribution was 10x lower than the average Council contribution across other trails and districts throughout New Zealand). This was based on The Old Ghost Road receiving a \$30,000 annual grant from Council at the time. When the decision to terminate the annual grant was made in the June 11, 2024 Buller District Council meeting, this then resulted in The Old Ghost Road becoming the only Great Ride in New Zealand not to receive Council support. In that meeting, one elected member suggested The Old Ghost Road ".....was quite a profitable business". The operation is actually marginal, takes a lot of hard work from a lot of people, and whilst annual accounts are yet to be prepared for the recent financial year, they will show a significant and unsustainable loss. The loss of Council funding has had a direct impact on this outcome. On a return-on-investment basis, there is likely a case to request a larger funding contribution from Council. However, the Mökihinui-Lyell Backcountry Trust appreciates the enormous challenges faced by Council in terms of meeting community needs and balancing affordability and is therefore limiting the extent of this request to that which existed previously and to recognise the significant economic, social, and environmental contribution The Old Ghost Road makes to the well-being of the Buller district. To provide perspective beyond our own, the below feedback represents the views of two Buller district stakeholders in relation to the tangible and intangible benefits delivered by the trail. • "My family has been living at Gentle Annie, 8km downstream of the Seddonville end of the Old Ghost Road for four generations. Since the mid 70's we have persevered making a living through horticulture, dairy farming and tourism with varied success. The opening of the Old Ghost Road was a real catalyst to sustainable tourism for the area and put the isolated region on the map. Presently, our camping ground and holiday home accommodation business now hosts 32,000 annual guest night stays. It's been amazing to see how proud locals are of such a popular community asset and how much this has positively changed the locals identity. The success of the Old Ghost Road has led to a sense in the community that the area we live in is really

valuable (people from all over New Zealand and the world come here now just to experience it). It's the first landmark that comes to mind when conversing with others from out of the area. It has empowered locals to explore and experience the beauty of the area, making them value it, rather than taking it for granted. From an economic perspective that would be hard to quantify, but what we know from thousands of conversations with our guests, is that the Old Ghost Road has emphasised the area as a destination, and from this initial visit that otherwise wouldn't have happened those guests then discover all the other wonderful attractions of the Northern Buller and return to visit with friends and family, leading to a positive cycle. Another positive economic benefit to the area, which can be captured in data, is that it directly results in increasing the length visitors are staying in the area. In 2025 the average guest night stay in Buller is 1.7 nights. At Gentle Annie it is 2.7 nights. This substantial difference in length of stay is directly attributable to activities and experiences that our guests can do, and the Old Ghost Road is at the top of the list. These aspects of the Old Ghost Road, that it has and continues to be a catalyst for sustainable tourism, and local health and well being, cannot be valued highly enough." - Northern Buller tourism operator, May 2025 • "The Old Ghost Road is one of Aotearoa's most extraordinary and iconic trails-85 kilometres of breathtaking scenery, rich history, and personal challenge. This incredible track is a shining example of what can happen when passion, purpose, and community come together. I do not support the two options provided by the Buller District Council in the draft LTP 2025. A Targeted Rate is a mechanism to charge those ratepayers who have a direct benefit for the work undertaken. The Carters Beach Community does not have any stormwater infrastructure that is connected to the Carters Beach sewer reticulation. If the Council can identify individual properties within Carters Beach who have a stormwater connection to the sewer reticulation, then it has been done so illegally and should be removed at the property owner's expense. Likewise, if there are a significant number of Westport property owners with stormwater connected to the sewer reticulation, then the cost of rectifying that should also be met by the property owners concerned. The problem in Westport may well be more complex than a simple illegal connection, therefore there could be a case for a targeted rate across all Westport ratepayers. When Carters Beach residents, and those properties south of Domett Street, were connected to the Westport sewer reticulation, all work inside the boundary of the property owner was at the cost of that property owner. There have been several instances throughout New Zealand where Councils have endeavored to charge a targeted rate to people who do not have a direct benefit. I am aware that where this instance has been contested, the Council has been proven to be incorrect in applying that target rate. There are insufficient options being offered in the LTP for this proposed rate: There should be a further two options in the LTP: These being: The removal of the illegal stormwater connections to the Westport sewer reticulation should be at the cost of the property owner concerned. And If the illegal stormwater connections are more complex than a simple property connection, then these costs may warrant a targeted rate across the Westport ratepayers.

For. this will be a good project and one that needs to be completed if there is any expectation of long term growth south of the Buller Bridge, at present you have a DN200 water main feeding carters beach with a DN315 new water main feeding Alma rd. this water main needs to be updated to at least match the Alma rd line if not larger.

## Q13. Westport drinking water: Re-establish the north branch/tunnel lining

Against. i think that the LTP document contains false information regarding to this project. the north branch water has been sampled by contractors and will not be suitable to "mix" with the south branch of the intake. the risk analysis states that if the south branch becomes unusable that Westport risks water outages this is correct as Westport currently does not have a secondary supply option, in my opinion introducing a secondary supply option at the same location is madness. if there is a AF8 both the north and south branch will be offline, the intake structure will likely be damaged and you are also forgetting that the north and south branch would be combining and both going through the same intake structure into tunnel 1, how do you propose to separate these supplies in the event that only the south branch was offline? build two intakes? the Risk analysis goes onto to state that if tunnel 1 collapses the work would be required under urgency.... if the north branch is introduced it will still need to run through tunnel 1 so in the event of a collapse both sources will be offline. i feel the information or the supply. Note tunnel 1 has been piped already but this is a steel pipe and H&B recommended that this be PE lined ASAP. the original price for this was \$1 million dollars, it will be interesting to see what this will cost now as all the baily bridges and access has been removed or washed away. spend this money on cleaning out the raw water ponds and securing more and better storage for the raw water. focus on locating a second supply option for Westport.

### Q14. Untreated drinking water supplies: Waimangaroa, Mokihinui, Little Wanganui

Against. again i think that this assessment is under estimated. to upgrade the northern Buller supplies to a point where the BDC can provide raw water that is suitable for end users to self treat would be a large undertaking. Waimangaroa - this would require some form of treatment plant undertaking filtration at a minimum and a massive amount of raw water storage. turbidity is high on this supply and introducing a turbidity sensor system would mean that this supply would be offline more than it is online without a sufficient filtration system at the source or along conns creek rd. introducing this along with a sufficient location with enough raw water storage that can still gravity feed water to the residents of Waimangaroa will cost a lot more than \$666k and the ongoing maintenance costs will be moderate to high. Mokihinui - this supply has several sources, one is gravity from a creek and the other is pumped from alongside the SH closer to town. during summer months the pumpline is used due to the creek drying up and the large amount of loses on the aging falling main. again during rain events this supply would likely be unusable and offline for prolonged periods of time if turbidity monitoring and valves were introduced, again this would result in massive amounts of storage required which would cost well in excess of the budgeted \$188k and the ongoing costs would be moderate again and not minimal as stated. ownership of this land is also an issue, BDC have an easement which was recently completed but no land for treatment plants or storage tanks. Little Wanganui very turbid water, this is a small supply that has regular problems. the supply comes from a small creek that is fed by a bush catchment and gets very dirty and turbid. it would experience the same issues as above and without some form of treatment plant providing filtration the supply would not be suitable for small filtration systems and UV. again land ownership is an issue as this supply is on private land and BDC have an agreement with the land owner which comes under fire at times. large amounts of storage would be required if the planned turbidity and valve upgrades were to be installed and again the supply would be offline for prolonged periods due to the high rainfall events. once again i believe that operating costs would be moderate to high as for all the supplies above you are having to to deal with raw water catchments that are prone to weather events, the are some distance from the main center of Westport and once upgrades were completed they would all require moderate to high levels of staff involvement to keep them online and processing water. the costs for all of these 3 locations have been grossly under estimated.

## Q15. Westport's wastewater: Riley Street Pump Station and network replacement

For. i agree with this project, this is one project that has been talked about for the past 10-15 years that i have been involved with BDC. upgrade and relocation of the pump stn is well over due. the larger issue is the aging infrastructure that has been inherited by the BDC from Housing NZ. it has long been argued that HNZ should be footing the bill for any works within the HNZ properties that connect to this pump station. back when HNZ stopped maintaining these houses the supply pipes were supposed to have asset assessments carried out / upgrades and then BDC should have had the option to inherit these lines OR gain funding to upgrade them at the time. now due to BDC inaction and lack of ability to hold HNZ accountable the process will fall on the rate payer to pick up the cost. again i think the estimate is low, i agree with the targeted rates and the operating costs once completed will also be minimal but i am frustrated that this is a BDC issue when NZ govt should be paying for this work or should have paid for it 20 years ago.

### Q16. Property: Replacement Emergency Operation Centre and Brougham House Buildings

For. these building are well beyond repair and should be replaced and combined. simple as that, the general rate option is a good one as all of the Buller will benefit from this upgrade. BDC also needs to consider that it is an employee and that poor working conditions maybe contributing to their high staff turnover they have been experiencing.

yes - as noted above i believe that several of your projects noted in the LTP are not required and rate payers need to have further (correct supporting )information before some of these are approved, the main one being the North branch as one of the highest budgeted costs this does not need to go ahead and will greatly reduce the cost to ratepayers over the next 9 years, money is better spend elsewhere, the LWDW proposal that is discussed in this LTP needs more thought and at this stage i don't believe that BDC has put enough emphasis on the inclusion of its council owned CCO, watch this space, a lot of the infrastructure works have good intentions and should go ahead, they need to go ahead but there are some that have clearly had input from BDC staff that are not telling the truth OR they do not know the information that they are paid to be coordinating and managing.

Punakaiki Community Facility One of the district's key population growth areas is south of Charleston from Woodpecker Bay/Fox River through to Punakaiki. House sales and resource consents will confirm that new residents are moving into this area, bringing with them the standard expectation that our council will be interested in supporting the community, particularly as it is to some extent a golden goose for the Buller GDP. Punakaiki features heavily in West Coast tourism figures, and the contributions to the Buller economy are significant. New ventures in the area are one of the reasons new houses are being built. There's a real opportunity for the Buller District Council to drive the establishment of a long-desired community facility at Dolomite Point. Many reports over many years have indicated the desire for a place for the local community to gather and be able to partake in community meetings, social gatherings, sporting, arts, crafts, connecting activities etc. Current and potential groups and organisations are stymied by the lack of public facilities in the area. It's clear a community facility in this area would be able to support itself with contributions from users, room hire from public, government and private organisations and individuals as it is a very attractive halfway point between Westport and Greymouth. Importantly, it would also provide a much-needed emergency operations and welfare centre for any civil defence emergency. Any meetings in private business premises are only able to be held at certain times of the day/year with the goodwill of the business owners. These are not independent facilities. These include community halls, theatres, walkways, trails, swing bridges, public access structures, aquatic centres, sporting facilities and meeting facilities. P140 • The provision and maintenance of amenities and reserves creates a pleasant environment in which to live, work and play, which is an important part of the vision for the district. Amenities and reserve areas provide for social interaction and promote sport and recreation. • Council-owned buildings allow for costeffective provision of property for community use. • Jointly funding facilities with other agencies allows the public access to facilities at an acceptable cost. Links to Community Outcomes: Social: "By providing areas for people to engage in healthy activities, social interaction and recreation. All this detail describes exactly what we want and need for Punakaiki. The best site for a Punakaiki Community Facility Punakaiki people remain committed to a Dolomite Point site I believe it is time to approach DOC and Ngāti Waewae to ascertain the possibility of leasing, for a community facility, a small parcel of land to the north of the rear cell of the Dolomite Point carpark and east of the Scenic Reserve, in the area that has been recommended by both the National Panel and the Mana Whenua Panel to be reclassified as Local Purpose (Punangairi Ngāi Tahu) Reserve. Informal discussions with Ngāti Waewae Chair François Tumahai indicate the iwi would be supportive of our endeavours to site our community facility on land there. It is our understanding that a further formal approach would need to be undertaken by the Buller District Council to arrange for the use of the land. Discussions have been held on how a community facility at Punakaiki might be funded and what it might look like. Described as a "glorified bush bach" at one meeting, the single-storey, mono-pitched, solar-powered small facility would most likely be between 150m2 and 200m2 with facilities to cater for meetings, a bathroom block, and storage space for community requirements - chairs/tables; emergency management equipment; storage for organisations and clubs etc - the types of things suggested through the community engagement undertaken in 2016 and 2022. Early estimates put the cost at around \$1.1 million, but more detailed costings will be undertaken as the facility progresses. Funding sources might include Buller District Council, Lotteries, local people, sponsors, Dolomite Point visitor donations, and other charitable sources. The Punakaiki - Woodpecker Bay community now requires a more substantial commitment from Buller ratepayers towards appropriate community outcomes for our residents through the next Long-Term Plan. It is my request that an initial \$500,000 be allocated, including funds for project management expertise.

Submission to the Buller District Council Long-Term Plan 2025 - Request for a Community Facility in Punakaiki Submitted by: Hilary Peal, May 2025 Dear Councillors, I am writing this submission as a new mum and a proud resident of Punakaiki, with the strong support of other local mothers and fathers who are also submitting their voices to this process. Together, we represent a growing number of families who have chosen to make Punakaiki our home - and we are urging the Council to prioritise the establishment of a funded, multi-use community facility in Punakaiki as part of the 2025 Long-Term Plan. Punakaiki is one of the Buller District's key population growth areas, with new families arriving, homes being purchased and new ventures taking root. For these families, including mine, the need for a central, supportive community hub is no longer a distant vision - it is an urgent necessity. A Place for Our Youngest Citizens As parents of young children, we currently face significant challenges with no public indoor space in Punakaiki where we can host playgroups, or early childhood activities. Our options are limited to travelling north to Charleston or south to Barrytown and beyond - a costly and impractical burden in terms of time, petrol, and logistics, especially with infants or toddlers. In a time when household costs are already high, this additional pressure is simply not sustainable for many families. Establishing a local facility would enable young children to engage in meaningful, place-based learning within their own community - a community nestled in one of the most unique natural environments in the country. Imagine a space where our tamariki can learn about the local ecosystem: the aweinspiring Paparoa National Park, the nearby river systems and walking tracks, the rare and iconic Westland Taiko, and the importance of predator control and conservation efforts. These are lessons best taught in connection with the land and the people who live here - and best nurtured in a space designed for local connection and engagement. A Community Hub for All Ages But this facility would not only serve our children. It would be a place for everyone in Punakaiki - young families, retired residents, artists, outdoor enthusiasts, and entrepreneurs - to come together. Reports over many years, including community engagement rounds in 2016 and 2022, have consistently shown the deep desire for a space to host meetings, workshops, sports, crafts, art exhibitions, health and wellbeing programmes, and civil defence functions. This need is currently unmet. Right now, public meetings - including those by council, government, and health organisations - must rely on the goodwill of private business owners to use their premises. These arrangements are not sustainable or suitable for community-led initiatives. A dedicated, council-supported facility would provide much-needed independence and continuity for local groups and services. Building Resilience and Initiative The proposed site - a small parcel of land at the rear of the Dolomite Point carpark, recommended by both the National and Mana Whenua Panels for reclassification as Local Purpose (Punangairi Ngāi Tahu) Reserve - offers a unique opportunity for the Council to work in partnership with DOC and Ngāti Waewae. Informal discussions with Chair François Tumahai indicate iwi support for this project, pending a formal approach from the Council. This is a chance to model respectful, future-facing relationships between Council and mana whenua. We envision a modest, functional, solar-powered building - affectionately dubbed a "glorified bush bach" - of around 150-200m<sup>2</sup>. This facility would feature meeting spaces, bathrooms, and storage for community-use equipment, and would serve as a vital emergency management centre during civil defence events. It would reflect the character of Punakaiki and be built sustainably to honour the surrounding environment. Funding and Sustainability Early cost estimates suggest a budget of around \$1.1 million, with funding likely to come from a mix of Council allocation, Lotteries, community fundraising, charitable grants, local sponsors, and potentially visitor donations from Dolomite Point. We are asking the Buller District Council to commit \$500,000 initially, including provision for project management expertise to ensure this project moves forward professionally and efficiently. Importantly, the facility would be able to support itself over time, with income from room hire by public, private, and government groups. Its location - roughly halfway between Westport and Greymouth - makes it a natural meeting point for the wider region as well. Strengthening Community Identity We want this facility to be a place where we can share our strengths. Local artists need an exhibition space. Our older residents deserve a warm and welcoming place to meet. Workshops and wellness programmes could be run by locals, for locals - fostering resilience, creativity, and belonging. Punakaiki has given so much to the region in terms of tourism and economic contribution. Now is the time for the Buller District to give back to Punakaiki. By investing in this community facility, the Council would be taking a meaningful step toward supporting its youngest and most vulnerable residents, strengthening local ties, and showing leadership in building inclusive, thriving, future-ready communities. We urge you to take this opportunity - to include this vital project in the Long-Term Plan, and to help our young families and wider community grow and thrive in the heart of Punakaiki. Punakaiki Community Facility - let's make it happen! One of the district's key population growth areas is south of Charleston from Woodpecker Bay/Fox River through to Punakaiki. House sales and resource consents will confirm that new residents are moving into this area, bringing with them the standard expectation that our council will be interested in supporting the community, particularly as it is to some extent a golden goose for the Buller GDP. Punakaiki features heavily in West Coast tourism figures, and the contributions to the Buller economy are significant. New ventures in the area are one of the reasons new houses are being built. There's a real opportunity for the Buller District Council to drive the establishment of a longdesired community facility at Dolomite Point. Many reports over many years have indicated the desire for a place for the local community to gather and be able to partake in community meetings, social gatherings, sporting, arts, crafts, connecting activities etc. Current and potential groups and organisations are stymied by the lack of public facilities in the area. It's clear a community facility in this area would be able to support itself with contributions from users, room hire from public, government and private organisations and individuals as it is a very attractive halfway point between Westport and Greymouth. Importantly, it would also provide a much-needed emergency operations and welfare centre for any civil defence emergency. The draft Long Term Plan [LTP] The draft LTP supports this type of initiative throughout: Key Considerations in drafting a long term plan p18: • Health and vitality of the community • Working to retain Buller as an attractive region to live, work and play . Adapting to changing environment, climate change and natural hazard threats. Our lifestyle is treasured, our strong community spirit is nurtured, and our inclusive and caring communities understand our Whakapapa and heritage Why we do it p86: Undertake Master Planning to ensure the future requirements of our townships are accommodated in relation to services, risk mitigation and social requirements. p127: Community Outreach days were established in September 2024 for a 12 month trial to provide residents in our outer laying areas the opportunity to meet, engage and connect with Council in informal, drop-in style sessions. Facilitated by staff from across all departments and with support from Elected members, the days are being held in our smaller communities: Charleston, Punakaiki, Northern Buller (Ngakawau), Karamea, Maruia and Ikamatua, with each community being visited at least every three months. If attendance numbers are consistent and feedback is received requesting the continuance of the days, Council will consider permanently introducing this platform as an ongoing engagement with our communities. Where are these sessions held in Punakaiki? Have they been held every three months? There is no available indoor public space for any Council, government, health/wellbeing, community meetings or consultations. Any meetings in private business premises are only able to be held at certain times of the day/year with the goodwill of the business owners. These are not

independent facilities. Cultural and community facilities, buildings and structures p138 A number of facilities, buildings and structures are owned by Council and made available for a range of cultural and community uses. These include community halls, theatres, walkways, trails, swing bridges, public access structures, aquatic centres, sporting facilities and meeting facilities. Not one of these examples applies to Punakaiki at present. Why are we involved in this activity? P140 • The provision and maintenance of amenities and reserves creates a pleasant environment in which to live, work and play, which is an important part of the vision for the district. Amenities and reserve areas provide for social interaction and promote sport and recreation. • Council-owned buildings allow for cost-effective provision of property for community use. • Jointly funding facilities with other agencies allows the public access to facilities at an acceptable cost. Links to Community Outcomes: Social: "By providing areas for people to engage in healthy activities, social interaction and recreation. All this detail describes exactly what we want and need for Punakaiki. The best site for a Punakaiki Community Facility Punakaiki people remain committed to a Dolomite Point site. I believe it is time to approach DOC and Ngāti Waewae to ascertain the possibility of leasing, for a community facility, a small parcel of land to the north of the rear cell of the Dolomite Point carpark and east of the Scenic Reserve, in the area that has been recommended by both the National Panel and the Mana Whenua Panel to be reclassified as Local Purpose (Punangairi Ngāi Tahu) Reserve. Informal discussions with Ngāti Waewae Chair François Tumahai indicate the iwi would be supportive of our endeavours to site our community facility on land there. It is our understanding that a further formal approach would need to be undertaken by the Buller District Council to arrange for the use of the land. Discussions have been held on how a community facility at Punakaiki might be funded and what it might look like. Described as a "glorified bush bach" at one meeting, the single-storey, mono-pitched, solar-powered small facility would most likely be between 150m2 and 200m2 with facilities to cater for meetings, a bathroom block, and storage space for community requirements - chairs/tables; emergency management equipment; storage for organisations and clubs etc - the types of things suggested through the community engagement undertaken in 2016 and 2022. Early estimates put the cost at around \$1.1million, but more detailed costings will be undertaken as the facility progresses. Enhancing Economic and Cultural Opportunities • The centre could host local markets, workshops, and events, supporting small businesses and artisans and providing new opportunities for economic development. • It would complement the visitor infrastructure, offering a venue for community-led cultural and environmental education, and helping to ensure that the benefits of tourism are shared more equitably with residents 4. Future-Proofing Punakaiki • As visitor numbers grow and infrastructure demands increase, it is crucial to ensure that community needs are not overlooked in favour of tourism alone • A community centre at Dolomite Point would integrate with the broader vision for sustainable development, enhancing both resident and visitor experiences while protecting the unique character of Punakaiki 5. Responding to Community Aspirations · There is a strong history of local advocacy for a dedicated community facility, with clear evidence of demand and disappointment at previous setbacks • Investing in a community centre would demonstrate the Council's commitment to inclusive, balanced development and help repair trust with Punakaiki residents. Conclusion The establishment of a community centre at Dolomite Point is not a duplication of existing facilities but a necessary step to address longstanding gaps in social infrastructure. The LTP proposal to increase these already high rates by another 5.5% is one we strongly oppose, and many in the community seem to agree. Public resentment will always increase when council spending continues without regard for the ability of the community to afford it. Low income families and pensioners will struggle most, and youngsters trying to get on the local property ladder will struggle to get a mortgage. Such high rates are, in our opinion, profoundly counter-productive because as more of the population is pushed into hardship and poverty, history shows this will result in an increase in social problems and crime, which raise additional costs for the local population. This also affects people's desire to move to or stay in this area, and selling property in such an environment becomes much harder. There seems to be a local growing consensus that rate rises, for whatever reasons, have gone too far and that a thorough review of BDC spending is needed to reduce rates and determine a more affordable and efficient way forward. Those we have spoken to overwhelmingly prefer lower rates over more services, and it stands to reason that local resentment will only increase as more people feel that they are being impoverished by excess council spending.

Submission Opposing Proposed Water Upgrades in Mokihinui To whom it may concern, As a resident of the Mokihinui area, I strongly oppose the proposed water supply "improvements" outlined in the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025-2034. The plan to spend \$188,000 on Mokihinui's untreated water supply, funded by targeted rates, is not justified and will impose unreasonable costs on our small community. Key concerns: 1. The water is not used for drinking in most households — it's primarily used for gardening, washing, and general domestic use. Imposing treatment standards that require end-user UV systems is unnecessary for the actual use case of the supply. 2. This project offers no practical benefit to many residents but comes with a financial burden through increased targeted rates. Many will also face the added expense of purchasing and maintaining UV treatment units. That's an extra cost the Council hasn't even tried to estimate or explain. 3. The proposal lacks transparency about the actual cost per household, and whether this includes operation and maintenance support or just installation. We deserve to know how much we'll be paying over the next 10-30 years. 4. Mokihinui is a rural and often low-income area. These kinds of upgrades are being imposed without genuine local consultation or evidence that they are supported by our community. 5. The principle of local water use must be respected. The proposed changes are one-sizefits-all and ignore how rural households live, source water, and treat it already. Local autonomy should matter under the "Local Water Done Well" reforms. In summary, I urge the Council to: - Reconsider the proposed upgrade to Mokihinui's water supply. - Allow residents to opt out or vote on such proposals before they are imposed. - Prioritize affordability, common sense, and true community needs over compliance for compliance's sake.

HNZPT recognises that the Long-Term Plan is a high-level document to provide direction for development initiatives and funding within the district. Within that, the Council has a responsibility to acknowledge the various tangible and intangible aspects of life that make up its heritage and ensure that these are appropriately represented within the Plan. Well cared for historic heritage is essential in creating an engaging vibrant region that fosters local identity, draws people in and helps to sustain the local economy. It is a fundamental part of the fabric of the community. 6. HNZPT supports the strategic framework within the Plan which aims to achieve community outcomes through building a thriving, sustainable and resilient future for the district. (64 3) 363 1880 Southern Regional and Canterbury/West Coast Area Office PO Box 4403, Christchurch Mail Centre 8140 heritage.org.nz Initiatives 7. HNZPT supports the proposed funding allocation for museums and heritage operations as outlined in the Plan. Provision of funding for these projects allows for community benefits and contributes towards the preservation and conservation of New Zealand's historic heritage. As such, HNZPT supports the allocation of funding towards this activity. 8. The allocation of funding towards the Community Development and Support activity will provide benefits for Buller's community facilities and projects. It is clearly a very large area with a spread population many of whom are not rate payers and I admire the ongoing commitment displayed by the BDC to the well being of our population. For an idea of the ways in which this hall is used I will here provide a list of activities and organisations which use the hall. This list is by no means exhaustive. Weddings, Christmas celebrations, Matariki Day, Kite Day, Waitangi Day, Mid Winter Swim, Rocky Point Run, Parties old and young, Council drop in consultation days, Speakers, Education, Sports, Garden Club, Yoga, Choir, St John's, Bathurst, Caring Families, Homebuilders, 21st gatherings and funeral celebrations. All this as well as being a working civil defence community help centre. I believe it is self evident that a community hub is vital to the needs of a safe healthy active and connected community. There are a number of ways in which our hall could be improved and I would like to facilitate these improvements with the help and support of Reserves Funding, Revitalization Funding or Creative Communities Funding. I believe it would be useful for matters such as these to be considered as part of the LTP to bring them to the foreground so they are not overlooked or inelegible for later funding options due to lack of notification. I will also apply on the LTP funding request form where I have managed to secure quotes. Upgrade Heating The wall heaters installed above the curtain rails along the hall walls have been in place for a rather long time and have become less and less efficient. Ideally these would be replaced with heaters of much higher efficiency both in terms of power use and effectiveness. This would enhance the user experience as well as provide a healthier environment for hall users especially in Winter. Mobile Staging There are a number of occasions when a stage platform would provide better access for hall users to the focus of an event, whether it be a bridal party, a safety briefing, a kapa haka performance or a band, a stage gives everyone both a visual and an auditory aid to hall activities. I would like to be able to purchase a mobile stage configuration that could be used both inside and outside and could be both mobile and stored conveniently Solar panel installation Because the hall is also a civil defence hub, It houses all the equipment necessary to facilitate community communications if a major event occurs. We currently do not own a generator or any source of power other than one solar panel which would not connect to hall services. Ideally if solar panels were installed we could provide a much safer warmer environment even as we give cups of tea and information. Back Wall Transformation The building report regarding earthquake risk which was provided by council to the Carters Beach Hall did not suggest any urgent changes but it did highlight some potential weakness in the back wall of the hall under certain circumstances. In order to both mitigate risk and to enhance the building It would be worth considering an upgrade to the back wall of the hall. Ideally the wall could be supported and the hall further upgraded at the same time by providing some expansive doors across the back of the hall leading to a decking area this would mitigate any risk, provide magnificent views, improve ventilation, invigorate hall usage, and tie the hall in to the wider reserve area. Disability toilets Many people who use the hall also use the nearby toilets. These have no disability access and are overdue an upgrade. Flood Mitigation I would like to include and endorse the concerns raised by the wider committee regarding the possible impact of Westport floodwalls on the Carters Beach Area. Carters Beach residents are concerned that the Westport Flood Wall modelling indicates flood waters will be redirected toward Carters Beach, traditionally an area with very little flooding. ### Q16. Property: Replacement Emergency Operation Centre and Brougham House Buildings

We support Council's intention to replace the Emergency Operating Centre and Brougham House buildings to ensure their usability after a severe earthquake. Having an operational building is vital to providing a safe and effective response in such events. We are also pleased to see Council's continued investment in its Senior Housing stock. The recent replacement of old stock with new housing that has been modified for seniors' needs will assist older residents to remain in their communities and keep their social and health connections. It will also assist Council by minimising the cost of maintenance and repair.

### Q17. Rubbish management: Upgrade to the Westport and Reefton Transfer Stations

We support Council's intention to focus on waste minimisation and management in the district, in particular the intent to reduce the amount of waste sent to York Valley. We also support the continued oversight of closed landfills and the monitoring of the nearby land and waterways. The forecasted increase in climate events will increase the risk of the landfills becoming exposed and may mean that a higher level of action will be necessary to address the risk or remediate an exposed site.

### Q18. Wastewater and stormwater separation

AWC support the activities to improve drinking water supplies, wastewater treatment and stormwater infrastructure as they protect and promote the health and well-being of both the environment and residents and visitors to the district. We support Council's intention to separate wastewater and stormwater in Westport and Reefton. We acknowledge the challenges this activity presents, particularly with funding, however protection of both property and the environment are important to health and wellbeing. We acknowledge Council is asking the community for input in the funding decision regarding separation in the Westport supply area. We note both Council options have Council delivering the programme, with two scenarios for funding, i.e. a targeted rate for the properties concerned, or a rate across all properties in the Buller district to spread the rates burden. A potential third option would be for property owners to arrange separation themselves and have the cost charged via a targeted rate on their property. This would allow property owners to do some of the work themselves at a potentially reduced cost to either of the two options within the draft Long-Term Plan.

Yes. Ngakawau Hector Water Society is well known to the BDC as a private water supply scheme and IS THE REGISTERED SUPPLIER OF DRINKING WATER TO THE NGAKAWAU HECTOR residents. It manages its own supply and maintenance issues without any input or assistance from BDC. Consequently the Water Rate component included in BDC rates demand needs to be removed summarily. The current arrangement for the BDC to collect this fee on behalf of the NHWS and keep in a separate account is no longer valid as it has failed and the Audit department has identified over \$350,000 of NHWS funds that should have been kept in a separate account which is now not evident indicating the BDC has illegally spent these funds on other requirements through the consolidated fund. This is a serious misappropriation of both NHWS and Ratepayers funds.

The NHWS has already invested in the appropriate technology including filtration and UV treatment that will be required by the new Government regulations and as the recognized and registered supplier of drinking water to Ngakawau and Hector residents will continue to work directly with the appropriate government departments to maintain and ensure compliance going forward. We absolutely reject this proposal as it has no legal basis whatsoever. In addition BDC already owes the residents of Ngakawau Hector the equivalent of over 10 years supply of water based on current rates versus that money already paid to BDC by the residents with no indication from BDC as to where that money now is and what it may have been used for.

Submission to the Buller District Council 25th May 2025 Introduction I will introduce this submission loosely based on my letter to the editor dated 12th May 2024, titled Heated Meeting at Karamea. I was the first to speak at that meeting and I asked how much debt the Buller District Council (BDC) had run up and was told \$40 million. \$20 million from central government and \$20 million from Local Government Funding Agency (LGFA). Out of the total population of Buller which is little over 10,000 that works out approx. \$4,000:00 per man, woman and child in Buller! And here is the sting they want to run up further debt by replacing their offices in Broughham St. Are they going to bulldoze the original building or sell it? Prior to the meeting on the 7th May I had based my line of questioning on Hamiltons Cr. Andrew Bydder's article Fixing Councils and the Money Tree. I have since delved into the BDC Long Term Plan (LTP) and have come to the conclusion that the cause of is: 'Natural' weather events? Cronyism and blatant mismanagement. OK so having collected the data I can offer solutions; but the solutions are not going to be very popular. Message from the Mayor and Chief Executive P4 The identified the high priority functions as roading and transport, stormwater, drinking water, rubbish parks and recreation etcetera. I think that in the light of present conditions we seriously need to cut spending to the bone. Social and cultural activities need to be pushed back. As an artist that would be painful, however it needs to be done. Legislative uncertainty around meeting govt compliance standards the councillors need to ask central government 'where does this agenda come from?' Does it come from central govt, or through central govt? I suspect it's a UN Agenda 2030 that is poking it's nose in our business under the pretext of climate change (which has always changed) and Managed Retreat that is also another excuse for a land grab. They also mention on p4 that the main challenges was two significant 'weather events'. The flooding in Westport could have been better managed by dredging the Op - - - - River and making a cut to the sea. I heard that from the locals of Westport - neglect - same with their water supply pipes. The other 'event' is having to with the 'ongoing impacts of the COVID 19 pandemic.' It was more of a psy-op plandemic hatched out by the WHO and backed by the WEF, this I can prove to any councillor with 90% accuracy! Anyone up for a bet? Why do you think pres. Donald Trump has defunded the WHO? When such dubious directives are issued from central governments the need to be (1) questioned (2) challenged and (3) pushed back on! Why Local bodies should Avoid Identity Politics! P11 The PM of Singapore Mr. Wong said that that identity politics is particularly toxic and divisive and when you look at countries such South Africa there lies the irrefutable proof. On YT last night I saw Pres. Trump in the White House wheeling in a TV showing Mr. Ramaposa of SA scenes of crosses of mass deaths of white settlers. This was not what Mandela wanted! Should NZ be going down this road and should councils be involved? On page 11 0f the LTP it cites sect 81 of the Local Govt Act as fostering and consulting with local lwi. Nothing wrong with that however I would like to know if the iwi rep with voting rights was voted in or not? I would have no problem voting for Maori based on merit not race. So Mr. Wong is not wrong! Water, Waste Water, Sewage, Rubbish,

Transport/Roads and Essential Services These are the essential services that the BDC should be focusing on based on a user pay system. I live in Karamea where there is no water reticulation system so I have a tank and I am responsible for that tank, stormwater and sewage. So I shouldn't pay rates on services I don't use. On the flip side I put very little pressure on the infrastructure that I would consider that there could be a standard trade off there. To encourage Tanks to replace pipes but it would have to be done in blocks. Also in the event of earthquakes tanks are a good back up. As for climate change? It has always changed our local bodies should not be gas-lighted any of the UN agencies. The BDC has adapted to climatic conditions for the last 150 years. We don't need their voodoo, wolves in sheep's clothing. Roads and Highways Living in Karamea I am glad the Bluff Highway restoration is financed 100% by the New Zealand Transport Agency. As this takes pressure off BDC, we as taxpayer will still have to pay and it bay be put on BDC as a special purpose road. The question we need to ask is;'who benefits?' The Local Dairy Industry that is Chinese owned should I think stump up with 50% of the costs. The weight of the milk trucks are the problem if the milk in a Karamea factory (now closed) produced powder milk that would radically reduce the weight. Becoming Guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency No Way if the LGFA can go where the sun don't shine and this raises a few questions:- (1) Is the LGFA a part of Local Government NZ? (2) Where does their funds come from? World Bank? Blackrock? ANZ? (3) Why has LGFA moved the loan cap from 100% to 280%? (4) Why should We/BDC under-wright other councils liabilities? And visa versa? This has come about in order to service the \$20 million caused by:- (1) Westport water woes and (2) the avoidance of dredging of the two Westport rivers. (3) failure to cut a direct channel to the sea on the North side of Westport. Solutions: The BDC has a big debt problem that will probably be inherited by our great grand children. I view this as financial warfare! There are external agencies who do not have our best interests in mind. Agencies such as UN, WHO, WEF and UN's ICLEA should be regarded as a fifth column! Don't believe me? then read Behind The Green Mask by Rosa Kieore, and follow Brush Junkie. Their modus operandi is infiltration on every level and councillors and staff really need to get their heads around this! Now that the BDC have got themselves into hock they are faced with the unpleasant task of servicing two debts. The first debt that should be tackled is the LGFA debt. The only way out I see is to strip BDC's assets! (1) the theatre the plan was badly conceived, no picture theatre is situated away from a street front. Check the books sadly it's a white elephant. (2) Parking space? Measure it up charge for parking or sell up. (3) Library? Sadly sell up. (4) Sports Centre sell up. (5) Any other assets that deem to be disposable. (6) Reduce staff by 10 - 33% etcetera I have saved the Clock Chambers; that need to be used. (7) Organisations touching the BDC for a loan the answer is NO! As with many other councils in NZ, waste and out of control, above inflation rate increases are forecast by BDC. This is unsustainable for people, particularly. in the area covered by BDC. If this is so, it should be made totally transparent so as rate payers we can lobby are MP to get this changed. Far too often BDC is wasting money on public projects that only a few people want. Concentrate money on what is needed, not some trendy project desired by a few councillors, looking to improve their promotion prospects.

We need an affordable rubbish collection system in the outlying areas around Westport, as a priority. In the draft LTP the example given for Punakaiki shows the compound rate increase as 160% by 2034. This will effectively mean the only people who will be able to afford to own property in Punakaiki will be those who use it for short-term rental. Punakaiki won't be a place where people can live and work and bring up families, it will be nothing more than a township of short-term stays with no vibrancy or resilience, the community will be hollowed out. Drinking water is the largest contributor to the hike. The Punakaiki water supply system has been repeatedly sabotaged for years now. Interfering with a drinking water supply is a criminal offence under the Crimes Act, the Water Services Act and BDC's own bylaws. The perpetrators of this sabotage have never been held to account. Instead residents continue to pay the cost - paying for the repairs, paying in terms of inconvenience when essential water use and boil water notices are issued and, for those who run businesses, paying due to compromised service to guests. There is also the matter of the damage the sabotage continues to do to the township's reputation. The projected rate increase adds great insult to the injury we feel as residents. Many of us are very much water aware and do as much as we possibly can to conserve water and not waste it. However it does not matter what care we take as the saboteurs repeat their attacks at the times when they know Punakaiki is at its busiest. This situation falls very short of meeting Council's Affordability and Social outcomes - ["our communities are supported by infrastructure, facilities and services that are quality, efficient, affordable and meet our current and future needs" & amp; "our communities feel safe, vibrant, healthy and connected". In addition I have yet to see anything from BDC which even mentions the possibility of other approaches to drinking water issues throughout the district. What about incentivising rainwater harvesting systems such as providing grants/ subsidies for residents to install rainwater tanks and/or offer rates rebates for properties using harvested rainwater for non-potable purposes? Think of how much water treated for drinking, at quite some expense, is currently used for washing cars just as one example. What about mandating rainwater harvesting in new builds -requiring rainwater collection systems in new residential, commercial, or public buildings? Encouraging better use of rainfall would build climate resilience, and reduce demand on potable water There are so many uncertainties ahead with Local Water Done Well but one thing is certain, a lot of money will be needed for water infrastructure across not just Buller but the Coast. DWC currently has funds of over \$140 million. Isn't it about time a long hard look was taken at how the funds could best be spent for the long-term economic benefit of the Coast as it was established to do? Using the funds to renew the water infrastructure of Buller, Grey and Westland would bring tangible economic benefits for residents and businesses now and for future generations. It would go a long way to achieving the Prosperity outcome - "our district is supported by resilient infrastructure that promotes and innovative and diverse economy, creating opportunities for self-sufficiency, sustainable growth and employment."

Was this necessary? Annual grants to sports and community groups? Resilient West Coast another secretive group - shares little to the community and very keen to support a high % of people from a small group supporting moving Westport. (Public poll not by BDC) shows the community doesn't support this. Funding spent on investigation this suggests \$750,000 +GST Funding for Alma Road consultation/subdivision \$200,000 + GST & amp; ongoing maintenance. \$500,000 spent on rubbish collection, ratepayers have been consulted, submitted, council decides another option, we resubmitted - the minority were listened to, now we are status quo while there is more consultation. The above funding/expenditure could have been channelled into flood wall protection - make Westport "Resilient". Originally Westport, Snodgrass and Carters Beach were included in flood wall plans, now with funding issues it is only Westport to have the protection, but all are to pay for this - is this a fair deal? TTPP has \$8.1 million debt coast-wide - ratepayers will need to pay this deficit. We are a low socioeconomic area. The rate increase are ludicrous, almost double over the 9 year period for Westport draft model. There are in excess of a million dollars in overdue rates at the present time according to council, are the ratepayers subsidising them through overinflated rates? This figure will get worse when people are unable to afford rates and with cost of living crisis WCRR will have a large increase for flood protection on our rates. TTPP has caused huge increases to insurance policies. On top of this we have the highest electricity charges in NZ. This is completely out of control.

KNECT is formally recognised within the KMTT's Strategy Implementation Pathway Plan (SIPP) as the means to collectivise and amplify community action across the Buller Kawatiri district. This concern is caused by a total lack of recognition within the Document of factors vital to achieving the stated Specific Goals of Affordability and Prosperity. Our region is designated as having Lower Socio-Economic status. I sought evidence that BDC had factored in a true understanding of the hardship a significant percentage of our population endure. I did not find it. We know. Our schools and agencies know, that there is great vulnerability within our communities resulting in disparity and disadvantage including: difficulty obtaining and maintaining homes, difficulty finding rentals, difficulty paying bills, difficulty affording insurance, educational disadvantage and wide ranging impacts to health, wellbeing, mental health and feelings of security. Of greater concern, in regard to your Specific Goals of Affordability and Prosperity, I found no recognition of or reference to the dramatic social, economic and financial impacts sustained by our district due to the Te Tai Poutini Plan Hazard Zoning that occurred over the past 5 years. This Zoning, even prior to official adoption, was added to property LIMS. Would be buyers and investors are already factoring in the disadvantage of building, buying or investing in Westport or it's iconic coastal communities. I do not submit to debate this topic but to point out that a Plan that has not attempted to calculate the far reaching impacts to our social, economic, financial and physical survival is deeply flawed. • Already Insurance premiums have rocketed impacting affordability . Some property owners cannot obtain insurance, stripping their asset and magnifying their sense of insecurity • New rules and restrictions have impacted the ability to build and extend . Land use rights are impacted. . Costs of building or extending have escalated . Properties have been devalued, saleability is dramatically impacted • Investors have been dissuaded from viewing our district as viable with their perceptions having been magnified by highly sensationalised nationwide Media releases. • Fear, uncertainty, and a limiting of choice have already occurred. People needing/wanting to move for family, health, work or education needs become trapped, suffering further penalty None of us know as yet the full import of what the Hazard Zoning outcomes will be. What we do know is that for many it has changed life as we previously knew it. Where have these dramatic impacts, coming on top of those already sustained through Lower Socio Economic disadvantage, been calculated in this Plan? How have you determined affordability?

I am making this submission on behalf of the Waimangaroa Volunteer Fire Brigade members. The reason I am submitting is because each year our Fire Brigade is involved in supporting the ANZAC Day commemorations, we put up the flag, arrange seating, collect for poppy day, and also have a community cuppa at our fire station after the service. All of our Fire Brigade members agree that for safety, it would be best to have a concrete path to our cenotaph where I've coloured yellow below on the map. This would allow the community to gather in the "Waimangaroa Heart" area which is circled in red. What is happening now is, because there is a concrete path leading to McGill Street, the crowd is gathering across the street and intersection which is not closed during the service, as this is the only access from the State Highway to access our village it is not practical to shut the road. They do this to avoid getting wet feet because the ground surrounding the monument is usually very wet. I haven't filled the form in to request funding as a community group because it was discussed with the Waimangaroa Heart team, they thought a new path might be able to be paid for using a budget for upgrades to parks or reserve areas. This request is different to the Waimangaroa Heart Project which improved the area nearby with the planting and community tables. Martin Sweetman, Local Granity/Waimangaroa Sub Branch of the Westport RSA representative also supports the idea for a new path, he suggested a wider path area for ease of access and for speakers to use when undertaking the services. The majority of users will be visitors so the TIF should be the major funder. Action requested: Decision to be made on improved access to toilets at Ikamatua. Public Toilets Springs Junction The current toilets were installed after the Kaikoura earthquake and will not be sutainable into the future. They are located on private land and there are traffic safety issues for users as they are very close to the forecourt of the service station. The is public reserve land close by with plans to have a travellers way station on this land, with parking and a plyground etc. This would be the ideal place for the toilets and with 85% of the travelers just passing through our district the funder should be TIF. Submission re Fairlie Engine Background: 1. The Fairlie Engine was donated to the Reefton Community by the Morris Family circa 1960 and was placed in the Church Street playground for children to play on. 2. By the late 1980s accepted standards for children's playground equipment had changed and hazardous equipment no longer was acceptable. The Fairlie Engine had been painted in red lead paint which was badly oxidized, presenting an obvious danger to children as well as the fall risks. 3. The Reefton Community accepted the need for removal but strongly opposed efforts by outside groups to take the engine from the town. It was agreed that it remain in Reefton as the Morris family intended and so it was moved to its present site on the Strand. 4. It was also agreed that an interested local group calling itself the Fairlie Engine Society, become incorporated and manage the project with the intention of restoration of the unique sole surviving piece of rail history. As time has shown us, this never happened and the engine as well as its shelter have continued to deteriorate. This Society never became incorporated and ceased functioning. 5. In the late 1980s the Reefton Community also identified that reinvigorating the town required landscaping and developing recreational opportunities on the Strand and all subsequent plans have incorporated this view. 6. Strand development has progressed steadily over this time and has certainly contributed greatly to the tourist experience and local recreation as well as elevating the town 'vibe' as originally envisaged. 7. In any functioning vibrant town, it is important to recognize, encourage and support active new groups with their projects that will, add momentum. One such group is working on the development of recreation opportunities associated with the skatepark including upgrades and new infrastructure. This will require relocation of the Fairlie Engine. 8. The Reefton Historic Trust Board (RHTB) has been incorporated since 1978 and has worked tirelessly since then to protect and restore the Courthouse, the Oddfellows Hall, Reefton Engine Shed and are currently working to complete the Reefton Railway Station as well as other Rail Precinct infrastructure which they own. 9. The Trust believes that the Fairlie Engine should be placed in its context and restored, rather than randomly positioned in the towns centre. The Trust has a site available that is planned for a display and workshop complex that would enable restoration to progress and viewing to continue. What we are Seeking: 1. That the engine, when moved, is relocated back to the Railway Precinct. 2. That the RHTB be given management of the engine with preservation as a priority and restoration as a goal. 3. That Council through Senior Manager Community and Chairperson Community Board maintain oversight as Trustees on behalf of the Reefton Community to whom the engine was gifted to ensure that it remains available for residents and in particular children, enabling recreation and educational opportunities. In Conclusion: The RHTB is a registered charitable trust and has open membership, so welcomes all people who wish to join or participate in Trust Board activities, thus allowing for community involvement in the Fairlie project. Moving the engine allows the final part of the 'Strand Project' to come to fruition. It provides a more certain future for an historically important part of New Zealand and indeed world railway heritage to finally begin it restoration and add further to Reefton's heritage story, which is now a very important driver of national and international tourism for the wider region. Thank you for your consideration of these matters and support in continuing growing tourism as an economic driver. We wish to be heard in support of our submission.

This technical advice on the Buller District Council Long Term Plan 2025-2034 has been compiled by the National Public Health Service (NPHS) Te Waipounamu region, Health New Zealand - Te Whatu Ora. NPHS Te Waipounamu services the South Island, including the Te Tai Poutini-West Coast region. 2. NPHS Te Waipounamu recognises its responsibilities to improve, promote and protect the health of people and communities of Aotearoa New Zealand under the Pae Ora (Healthy Futures) Act 2022 and the Health Act 1956. 3. Pae Ora requires the health sector to protect and promote healthy communities and health equity across different population groups by working together with multiple sectors to address the determinants of health. 4. NPHS Te Waipounamu is focused on the achievement of equitable health outcomes. We use the Ministry of Health's definition of equity: In Aotearoa New Zealand people have differences in health that are not only avoidable, but unfair and unjust. Equity recognises different people with different levels of advantage require different approaches and resources to get equitable health outcomes.1 5. This document sets out matters of interest and concern to NPHS Te Waipounamu, and information included is based on evidence about public health and equity. General Comments 6. Health and wellbeing are influenced by a wide range of factors beyond the health sector. These factors are often referred to as the 'social determinants of health,' and can be described as the environmental, economic and social conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age. 2 The diagram3 below shows how these determinants of health are complex and interlinked. Initiatives to improve health outcomes and overall guality of life must involve organisations and groups beyond the health sector, such as local government, if they are to have a collective impact.4 Figure 1: Social determinants of health Specific Comments Investment in drinking water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure 8. Access to safe water and sanitation is a fundamental human right and is essential for public health. Accordingly, NPHS Te Waipounamu is pleased to see Council's intention to uphold this right in the Draft Long Term Plan (LTP 2025-34), with the emphasis being placed on investing in improving and maintaining three waters infrastructure and services. 9. Three waters services and infrastructure need to be fit for purpose, so that they meet demand now and in the future. Infrastructure should be reliable and resilient, particularly under pressure from increasing environmental hazards resulting from climate change. Infrastructure and services should also comply with regulatory standards to protect the health and wellbeing of end users and the environment. 10. Specific comments on each of the three waters services are set out below. Drinking water 11. Access to a sufficient, safe and reliable drinking water supply enables healthy lifestyles and helps to prevent the spread of communicable diseases. 12. NPHS Te Waipounamu is pleased to see that Council intends to invest in new and existing drinking water infrastructure in Westport. 13. NPHS Te Waipounamu notes that Council has undertaken proactive discussion of aspects of their approach to developing their Local Water Done Well (LWDW) delivery plan with Taumata Arowai. We intend to provide separate technical advice to Council on their LWDW delivery plan when it is released for public

consultation. 14. NPHS Te Waipounamu acknowledges the challenges Council faces in attempting to supply safe drinking water to Little Wanganui, Mokihinui, Waimangaroa (and Granity / Ngakawau / Hector). 15. However, we would encourage Council to continue to investigate all practicable and equitable drinking water delivery options to these settlements. The installation and maintenance of self-treatment of non-potable water may not be affordable for all households. The regulator. Taumata Arowai, may also not consider the continued supply of untreated non-compliant drinking water acceptable. Wastewater and stormwater 16. Improper or inadequate management of wastewater and stormwater can pose public health risks via direct exposure to wastewater and from environmental contamination with disease-causing organisms and harmful chemicals. These risks can be reduced by preventing spills, leakages and overflows of untreated wastewater, and by the appropriate treatment of wastewater and managed discharge to the environment. 17. NPHS Te Waipounamu is pleased to see that Council is considering practicable and equitable options to reduce high volumes of stormwater so that the risk of overwhelming the wastewater network during medium-high rainfall events in Westport is reduced. 18. NPHS Te Waipounamu also supports Council's plan for improvements to the Riley Street pump station and the wastewater network to ensure the location and condition of the infrastructure is suitable both now and in the future. 19. NPHS Te Waipounamu also supports Council's intention to invest in stormwater infrastructure in Reefton, to reduce the pressure on the wastewater system during medium-heavy rainfall events, reducing the risk of overflows. Flood protection and climate change 20. Climate change is a key public health issue affecting the health and wellbeing of communities in the Buller District and throughout New Zealand. More frequent and severe weather events, resulting from climate change, increase public health risks such as injury, exposure to floodwater, waterborne diseases, food insecurity, lack of access to or loss of critical infrastructure, and displacement of people. 21. NPHS Te Waipounamu supports Council's commitment to proactively consider the effects of climate change in the Buller District, particularly by embedding resilience into infrastructure renewals/upgrades and integrating flood protection measures and taking into account climate projections in its long-term planning. Waste management 22. Improper management of waste can pose public health risks from exposure to pathogens and contaminants in the environment and vector-borne diseases. NPHS Te Waipounamu supports Council's plans for investment in management of waste in the region to improve efficiency and effectiveness of the service. 23. NPHS Te Waipounamu acknowledges the challenges Council faces with managing closed landfills in the region (Westport and Birchfield in particular) and the associated remediation and erosion protections required to ensure the landfills are securely contained. 24. Considering the historic issues with these landfills and the potential threats to public health from contaminants and leachate, NPHS Te Waipounamu encourages Council to ensure that there are robust and resilient plans and investment in place to manage the legacy issues caused by these landfills. Conclusion 25. NPHS Te Waipounamu does not wish to be heard with respect to this technical advice.

Far too wordy lacking in financial fact. Commercial sensitivity hides very necessary data. Some if commented on would be illegal. I am making this submission against all the collective significant capital expenditures proposed in the Long Term Plan for 2025 - 2034. Council Borrowings and overall Debt far exceed prudent risk. In particular, I am making this submission against any further "dredge refurbishment". Reference - page 148 \$3.42m. \$1.83m over the next three years followed by another \$1.59m between 2028 and 2034. We are in a situation where Kawatiri's earnings are, and will be, hopelessly insufficient to provide any return on that 'invested capital'. Council are unable to demonstrate the exercise of proper governance and of due diligence in supporting such a major expenditure programme. I note that a report from Harbourmaster Dominic Venz at the RAC meeting in April 2024 was 'received for information'. No questions were asked about the cost of what he reported as "the proposed replacement of the starboard and port main engines and each engines gearbox". Mr Venz said the current capital programme is to replace these in the 2025/2026 financial year. In presenting this, there was no accompanying technical verification by nationally qualified engine surveyor that supported this significant replacement of a major part of the vessel. It is noticeable that since the Mudgway rmc2 presentations several favourable and unfavourable statements/reports have been presented with precious little justification provided to support them. These, are apparently, to suit the circumstances of the moment and to improve the chances of a budget being approved. It is simply not good enough just to accept "The staff said" when voting considerable sums of ratepayer's money. In depth technical reports need to be provided to substantiate for the expenditure. No one at the Council table, or staff have the qualifications or technical knowledge to verify the necessity. A correct policy procedure needs to have been followed with documentary evidence to support the recommendation of such large expenditure. Council did agree in last year's EAP for mechanical work on the engines (deferred until 2025/26) at a cost of \$380,000. Part of the \$818,000 capex budget approved in 2024. So has something changed? How has \$380,000 grown into \$1.83m without any discussion, understanding or approval from the Council table. Is it just going to happen because it's in the LTP and no-one has picked up this significant increase from what was approved at the EAP last year? What is the explanation for this? There needs to be detailed reason to approve this additional spend and, if the budget provided last year was deemed insufficient, then that should have come back to Councillors with professional engineering data explain, to understand and consider before being placed in front of ratepayers as simply a "given" for 2025/2026 budgets not just accepted as OK because they're in a report "received for information". The engines we are told are now at "end of life" and as such increase the risk of failure - but are they? The background and reliability of Blackstone Mirlees engines are legion as evidenced by their choice as power for the standby generators in British Nuclear power stations. Reconditioned engines of the "E" type in Kawatiri are readily available from

several companies of which these are couple: https://www.adsalesltd.com/ also а http://www.dfcspares.com/remanufactured-engines/ Engine spares are available through several suppliers and procurement agents. As an example, I obtained 12 pistons, Lloyds surveyed for the main engines. Kawatiri's Mirlees engines were always carefully and regularly maintained over a long period of time by C/E Lewis Holland to manufacturers specifications during my tenure and beyond. Lewis had the highest Marine Engineering exam results in NZ when he sat his engineers certificate and is on record as being meticulous. To say they were poorly maintained, as in some reports I have read, is slanderous. Mirlees engines, like all well-known Marine diesel engines are built to be maintained for a long indefinite life with spares to suit. With an ad-hoc employed crew, maintenance and use will be of varying quality, no matter if they are Mirlees or Cummins type, existing or new. Fancifully, we are told by BDC staff the new engines and gearboxes will improve the value of Kawatiri. Kawatiri's value these days will always be one in the owners and potential buyer's opinions but, eventually, if offered for sale, the buyers will predominate. With the very public and much discussed situation regarding the dredge in all aspects, if the buyer is aware of the reason for selling, then they can determine the price they might pay. To pull a figure of \$2 million out of the air as assumed in BDC insurance documents is pure speculation. Currently she has no determined value other than to BDC. With a close to \$5 million debt on the books somewhere and no signed long-term contract other than dredging the floating basin which will be at cost, Kawatiri could be given away as a Xmas Cracker gift. We've invested more borrowed capital on a 46-year-old vessel than can be proved prudent, to supposedly improve the vessel's profitability without any security for repayment of that debt which will be forfeited in the event of a default by the ratepayers. The hope that Port Nelson maintenance dredging will continue is looking less and less likely as Dutch Dredging are in earnest discussion with Port Nelson for a 10-year contract. Included is the likelihood they will be getting a DOP so bang goes Kawatiri's supposed advantage if hers becomes operational. The "Albatros" foremast is certified for a 4 metric ton hoist to handle a DOP. How on earth BDC could not see that would happen. Dutch dredging has the expertise in dredging Nelson as they have Kawatiri's ex master who they highly regard, having invested in training and higher certification for him, they have a fleet of vessels they can swap or call in along with an expert dredging management. BDC staff may be willing, but they are most definitely not those of a Dredging company, have zero marine expertise, are advised by a casual contractor with Kawatiri crewed on an ad-hoc casual basis as and when required. Dunedin and Napier have contracted for a new build dredger of the same size as Kawatiri to be delivered next year. This will undoubtedly have spare time available to contract for other dredging requirements especially as she will be able to dredge deeper than Kawatiri. The Wednesday 28th May 2025 Council Meeting agenda exposes previously expressed Commercially Sensitive Port and Dredge financial figures in full. How could the BDC possibly have constructed the fiscal content of the proposed LTP as it refers to the port and dredge in light of this fanciful irresponsible data? I'm appalled. For all these reasons I must make this submission against any further capital expenditure on the dredge and that, furthermore, a monetary cap be placed on the combined accumulated ring fenced debt. My submission regarding the Westport's Wastewater and Stormwater segregation 3. is that neither option offered is favoured at all. The cost of segregation must be for the actual property owner. Whatever the property situation is at present was passed by the BDC at the time of building application or historically evident. Should that situation need to be updated to comply with current or new regulation it is for the current owners cost. My submission regarding BDC becoming a guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency 4. is that I strongly oppose the whole proposition in its entirety that the BDC becomes a guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency. There is no proper business case in support of this proposal and, worse, no explanation of the extent of the liability Buller rate payers would face should this financial instrument fail. As such, becoming a guarantor holds the ratepayers as hostages to fortune with no guarantees as to the extent of their potential liabilities. My submission regarding "The BDC vehicle fleet being reviewed in this Long-Term Plan. Assumptions have been made that the fleet will reduce and the current 3-year replacement of vehicles will be pushed back to a minimum of five years, unless excessive mileage or vehicle condition dictates otherwise. Based on my own experience, BDC policy should be that replacement cars be Hybrid vehicles. I changed our car to a Hybrid which has produced very significant reduction in fuel costs let alone emissions over our previous ICE powered car. I strongly advise against pure EV vehicles as they being more expensive to purchase and requiring the extra expense of charging points to be installed. Brougham House and EOC I totally oppose the whole idea of making provision for the demolition and replacement of the civic offices in the LTP which has no supporting business case, no explanation as to how the estimate of NZ\$6.1m was arrived at, (which I suspect is a gross underestimate), and the level of current account cost of providing temporary accommodation for the Council during on site works. The often irresponsible comments purporting to the physical facts after an earthquake, takes no account of what the building code aims to achieve. That is to provide a building that will not totally collapse into a pile of rubble but protect its occupants to survive and escape. As is mostly evident after significant NZ Earthquakes, clearance and rebuild takes place at an epicentre and surrounds but at the time of the actual earthquake focus is on survival of building

occupants. As Brougham House meets the code required it is irresponsible to demolish and rebuild especially under the "Good idea lets borrow and build a new building" with figures pulled out by the "Alice in Wonderland" situation at present sprung so sensationally. Current Governance Buller District Mayor and Councillors should provide governance to set direction, monitor and review Council performance. These are the actions and processes by which stable practices and organisations arise and persist. Governance involves the system by which an organisation is controlled and operates, and the mechanisms by which it, and its people are held to account. As is witnessed in this LTP, Governance and leadership is sadly lacking.

7. Projected Punakaiki rates increases of 160% by 2034 threaten to make living in Punakaiki unaffordable. Obviously, this would be devastating for current residents, and would dissuade others from settling here unless they were particularly well off or were planning to rent their property to short term visitors, adding to the current shortage of long-term rental accommodation and hollowing out the soul of the community. Certainly young families, a desirable cohort, would be dissuaded from moving here. Punakaiki, with Reefton not far behind seems to be being hit disproportionately. Why is this? This all adds to my continued regret we were unsuccessful in our bid to establish a Paparoa Ward back in 2019. We very much need a councillor to go in to bat on our behalf.

WESTPORT WASTEWATER. I selected Option 1, a targeted rate charged to properties in Westport and Carters Beach. However, this is because as a Punakaiki resident I would be subject to targeted rates to bear the cost of our [oft sabotaged] water supply. In principle, I believe we should all share the cost for all district services. I say 'in principle' because I don't know the financial implications. I'd like to see a rates costing for 'everyone shares the cost of everything' throughout the district, reflecting our interdependence. KEY PROJECTS I am surprised not to see the Punakaiki water supply on this list of key projects. The community needs to know our Council is committed to a solution, and what is currently being done to secure our water supply, beyond planning a monstrous leap in targeted water rates, from around \$1400 to \$5000 by 2034. This is rather more than an "average in a range of 5.6% to 10.0% over the life of the plan" Surely this is to pay for a solution, not to cover further continuous sabotage? I understand Council is in an unenviably difficult position over the Punakaiki water supply, given missed opportunities in the past to secure the land and given the hostile attitudes of current landowners. However, the community needs reassurance that a solution is being pursued. A COMMUNITY FACILITY AT PUNAKAIKI Acknowledgement of Council commitment Punakaiki was delighted by Council's announcement of the Community Facility seeding fund in the 2015 LTP. Here was meaningful recognition of a decades-long call from the community, officially recognised as long ago as 2003 in the 'Punakaiki Development Plan' prepared for BDC by Glasson, Potts and Fowler, which recommended BDC and the Punakaiki community pursue a "small multi-purpose community centre ... to accommodate small meetings, playgroup meetings, recreational group meetings etc." Increasing need for a Punakaiki community facility I cannot over-emphasise the enduring need for a neutral public venue in Punakaiki, for all the uses itemised in the 2016 BDC Needs Assessment [extract appended], and others which have evolved since, for example public meetings on the Punakaiki water supply, the Greater Punakaiki Masterplan, the Dolomite Point Redevelopment Project, turning off the streetlights in summer, Civil Defence, Meet-the-Candidate for national elections, and two events for Local Government elections. For these, organisers have been beholden to Pancake Rocks Café, Punakaiki Tavern, the campground, Beach Hostel, or to DOC. Most mean prevailing on and sharing business premises, not always a comfortable or appropriate mix. Use of the DOC workshop, the closest we have to a neutral venue but still not a public space, has meant community members

spending the best part of a day cleaning and reorganising, hefting heavy equipment clear, lugging gear for refreshments from our own homes, borrowing and transporting chairs from the campground, and then putting it all back together again afterwards. It's a disincentive to meet. Civil Defence The need for a high-and-dry Civil Defence centre at Dolomite Point, where the majority of stranded tourists are likely to be and will need information and possibly shelter should SH6 north and/or south of Punakaiki be blocked, is paramount. The lack of such a facility is a huge gap in our community's resilience preparation. The coalition government's new Emergency Management Bill and its aim to strengthen community and iwi participation in emergency management lends support to this, and Resilience funding may lend financial support. The need for a stand-alone facility Ngāti Waewae owns and manages Punangairi, the new Dolomite Point Visitor Centre. It is an iwi resource, run and made commercially viable according to their business plan, and the mezzanine meeting space cannot be expected to fulfil the community need for a place of our own. Please refer again to the Needs Assessment: many of the uses e.g. playgroup, table-tennis tournaments, painting workshops, community radio station, would not be any kind of a good fit for the Punangairi mezzanine, and/or could not be carried out within opening hours. Iwi leaders François Tumahai and Ned Tauwhare support a stand-alone community facility at Dolomite Point, mentioning, in their 2019 letter of support [appended], that the iwi may also have occasion to use it. Fund-raising Fund-raising would require a major effort, over and above Council's seeding funding, but the local working group, active in 2019-2020 in support of Council on this project, did significant research into potential avenues of funding, holding positive meetings with organisation representatives e.g. Lotteries; Dept of Internal Affairs, and DWC. The seeding funding was always part of these discussions, showing the project had genuine potential. We need to retain the funding to retain momentum. I note the 2025 funding request form attached to the LTP consultation material. However, as Punakaiki does not yet have a site for the community facility, and therefore no invoices, this avenue is not yet appropriate for us. Acknowledging needs of Punakaiki ratepayers I am pleased to read on p5 of the Consultation Document that BDC councillors are committed to keeping community wellbeing outcomes in the LTP. Thank you - and a community facility in Punakaiki fits cleanly into this category. The draft LTP goes on to support our aspirations for a community facility under 'Community Outcomes', listing wellbeing outcomes such as "our communities feel ... connected [and] supported by infrastructure, facilities ... that meet our current and future needs". These aspirations could have been lifted from local Punakaiki submissions supporting the 2019 BDC application for a site. Many Punakaiki people particularly those who wrote submissions and spoke at the hearing for the 2019-2020 site concession - felt let down by Council's 2020 withdrawal of that consent application. Funding now would help restore confidence that Council recognises our needs down here in Punakaiki. Budget pressure on Council is understood. However, that doesn't mean Punakaiki ratepayers are okay to struggle on without a place to meet or a central Civil Defence centre. Especially as we face an enormous rates increase over the next few years! If an organisation or individual in Westport wishes to hold a public meeting, an art exhibition, or a playgroup, they have a choice of public spaces, and rightly so. The Punakaiki community is only asking for one such venue. Waimangaroa has one, Ngakawau, Little Whanganui, Mōkihinui, Maruia, Sergeant's Hill, Carters Beach, Inangahua, Reefton, Charleston ... Conclusion Considering the escalation in building costs since 2015, please consider allocating at least \$350,000 seeding funding for use in investigating and acquiring the site and furthering the Punakaiki community facility project. A total of 140 dwellings were identified within the community of interest. The BDC posted the questionnaire to 160 rateable property owners from White Horse Hill to the Punakaiki River. Another 35 dwellings / properties from the Punakaiki River south to Canoe Creek were identified and delivered or emailed the questionnaire. The response: • 140 dwellings / properties were identified. These are a mix of tourism industry businesses, commercial accommodation, private residences and private baches. • A permanent population of 150 people live in this area of the Coast Road for most of the year. The population increases during the summer months. • There are 15 school aged children and 5 pre-schoolers. • A total of 119 completed questionnaires were received from a total of 161 people. - Master Plan \$130,000. Governance direction here should be a focus purely on securing the Landcorp land from Central Government in perpetuity. Simply a deed of gift/first option agreement is needed at this point in time to secure the land if needed. The rest will follow naturally with no need for anything other than modest measures at this point. Port and Dredge Dredge & amp; Port Unreasonable assumptions around Port and Dredge revenue were flagged by the auditors during the last LTP of 2021-2031. Those concerns have now been underpinned with the failure of a Heavy Mineral Sands industry to utilise Westport Harbour for shipping. Consequently, you can now take this opportunity to consider the resultant effects on debt, and to revisit the subject with ratepayers. When assumptions of projected revenue in a council's LTP are considered "unreasonable" we usually see an auditor flag these. We saw this with the mineral sands revenue assumption of \$25.2m in 2021 and now see in relation to the Karamea Special Purpose Road at \$42.8m. So I was naturally surprised that in this LTP, with assumed port, dredge and airport revenue of over \$40m in the next 9 years, that the auditors didn't report any concerns. Ernst and Young auditor Stuart Mutch only noted verbally, under questioning at a council meeting, that council assumed it would make more money after spending on improvements to the dredge, and that that assumption "didn't appear too extreme compared to the 2021-2031 LTP". So let's take a closer look at the 2021-2031 LTP, and its associated Audit report The exact words of the auditors then, were as follows: Basis for qualified opinion - Reasonableness of significant assumptions Westport port and the Kawatiri dredge As outlined on page 156, the Council has assumed that \$25.2 million in revenue will be received from a large commercial operator, throughout the 10 years of the plan. This revenue is needed for dredging the Westport harbour, which will be required for the operator to ship out of the port. We consider this assumption is unreasonable because there is no contract in place with the potential operator to secure this revenue. If the large commercial operation does not proceed, then Council will not receive this revenue and the Council has signalled that no additional costs will be incurred to dredge the Westport harbour. However, fixed operational costs will continue, and these would need to be funded through other port revenues or by some other means. If we consider what has occurred between then and now: 1. The auditors were correct - the large commercial operation and money set aside for dredging for that operation, did not fully proceed as planned. 2. The auditors were correct - fixed operational costs did continue (along with substantially more expenditure) and we've had to fund those by "some other means" i.e. at best through government money and at worst, more debt and a reduction in our term deposit revenue with its subsequent impact on rates. Of course the flood money helped. Westport's misfortune produced money for the dredge. Central Government provided funding for flood

prevention and port infrastructure. Many months were spent dredging alongside the wharves, however I've not seen any reports as to how that helped mitigate flood risk. The dredge was never a flood prevention mechanism. It was used to keep operational river channels deep enough for Holcim's two cement ships. We've also clearly spent a lot on refurbishing Kawatiri with this taxpayer money. The dredge account provided through the Risk & amp; Audit Committee shows us over \$12m in revenue as at Feb 2025 but it is still in significant debt. In 2021, I objected to the LTP options and the proposed capital expenditure provided for the dredge, suggesting that if the "large commercial operator" we now know as Westland Mineral Sands (WMS), needed a dredge for its operations, then that company and its shareholders should buy it. This suggestion was not taken up by WMS or by Council. Nevertheless, BOC expenditure on the dredge all began off the back of assumed port and dredging revenue from WMS. In the meantime, following the Manahau barge grounding at Carters Beach in 2024, WMS is quickly proving a logistical business case for transporting its product via road to the benign waters of Port Nelson. They appear to be doing a good job of that, whilst supporting Buller via jobs at the mine and renting some space at the wharf. This is a good thing, but it's not the game changer for the port that we were expecting. In summary to the above, I think we need to be taking a harder look at finances in light of what has happened since 2021. In reality the 2021 assumption warning based on "no contract in place" remains valid today, particularly now that significant assumed revenue from out-ofport dredging contracts is seen to be the "business" that we are basing a lot of this expenditure on. Council staff seem adamantly confident of new out-of-port dredging contracts that will reduce debt and produce a profit over the life of the plan. But will they? There was similar confidence in the WMS operation happening. I went looking for financial detail about the out-of-port contracts in the LTP draft. Page 155 is the only place that provides any year-by-year financial information. It takes the form of a Funding Impact Statement (FIS) for Commercial Infrastructure. This category includes the activities of the Airport, Westport Harbour and the dredge. Under the loose heading of "local authorities fuel tax, fines, infringements fees and other receipts" we see significant revenue. A staggering \$37.9m of it. Fees and charges add another \$2.8m to that tally and rates taken for the airport are \$2.1m. Total \$42.Bm The funding impact statement makes it very hard for ratepayers to determine how much revenue or expenditure has been allocated against either the airport or the port and dredge but I calculate that the bulk of the assumed revenue is planned to come from dredge operations - likely more than what attracted auditor attention back in 2021 to be honest. Of the total \$42.8m in planned revenue over the life of the plan, \$30.4m will go to "staff and suppliers", \$404,000 will be spent on "finance costs", \$4.4m will go in house on "internal charges" and \$6.9m is being applied to capital funding including the airport's new runway at \$914,000 and the dredge at \$3.42m. By my calculations just \$786,000 will end up paying down debt over the life of the plan. It appears that "staff and suppliers" are the winners here, and that those ultimately responsible for unpaid debt i.e. ratepayers, are not seeing any major reduction, just the very real risk of less revenue and more debt than forecast. One clear component related to financials for Westport Harbour in this LTP is the "significant capital expenditure" proposed for further "dredge refurbishment". One line at the bottom of page 148 shows this as another \$3.42m. \$1.83m over the next three years followed by another \$1.59m between years 2028 and 2034. s Why is there a need for further capital expenditure on the dredge when we've already spent millions on it? A LGOIMA request by David Barnes earlier this year revealed that the only funds leftover from last year's Enhanced Annual Plan Kawatiri upgrade budget were for "mechanical items" (deferred until 2025/26 at a cost of \$380,000). If you look at the FIS, that's now grown to \$1.076m in 2025/26. How much of that is for the port & amp; dredge? I suspect a lot, and that is concerning. I also note decreasing reserves in years 1, 2 and 5 of the plan. Significant assumed income places reserves at further risk if you proceed with capital expenditure as planned. And do we actually have any relevant reserves to start with? The forecast statement of reserve funds from July 2025 suggests none for Westport Harbour (page 181) unlike the same forecast in last year's EAP which predicted a deficit in Westport Harbour reserves as at June 2025 of over \$1m. Page 191 of the plan tells us that "Kawatiri is now in a position to earn regular income" since its upgrades and the installation of new equipment. The recent slipway visit to Nelson (for which we don't yet have the full costs) must have improved things still further. Consequently, I am concerned about more significant expenditure on this vessel, particularly a further \$1.83m in the next three years, based on what we now know can happen. I remain doubtful about any long-term sustainable dredging work that purports to provide what I estimate to be approx. \$30-35m in revenue over the next 9 years. If it's signed, sealed and profitable enough work to significantly reduce our current debt without further expense, then great, but this LTP doesn't seem to be doing that at all. At the time of writing there are no signed out-of-port contracts. Dutch Dredging has just recently completed two large jobs at Taranaki and Gisborne, and will be looking to renew their work at other ports and expand into others. The new dredger being built in a partnership arrangement between Otago and Napier will be seeking other work through a newly formed dredging company. They have stated that "given New Zealand's relatively small size, this investment is a financially astute approach to ensuring the country's port infrastructure is well placed to meet the future demands of global shipping." Consequently I ask that you, as our elected representatives and those who oversee control,

direction, checks and balances on our behalf, please consider taking a cautious approach. Let's not spend any more on the vessel, until we know we've definitely got those new long-term sustainable contracts and that their net earnings will produce a profit and significantly off-set the current debt. Why not give that just a few more years to ascertain? Hang fire, instead of providing a mandate for immediate further expenditure via this LTP. The financial impact is high if the assumed revenue doesn't eventuate (refer page 191). The "sunk cost fallacy" can be a vicious cycle. You're deep in a money hole, and instead of climbing out, you decide to dig deeper because, well, you've already dug yourself in so deep. The more we invest, the more we feel committed to continuing the project. We all do this. It's natural not to want to let reality upset our dreams. But when it's ratepayer money you're gambling with, that approach is not fiscally responsible. If the WMS and/or out-of-port work doesn't eventuate, we risk spending more than the vessel is worth. I think we already have. b As some will know, I attempted to secure more work for the dredge between 2018 and 2021. I too described Kawatiri as "niche" to port companies all over the country. I found no long-term work for her, bar a couple of one off jobs which ultimately did not generate sufficient revenue to sustain the escalating costs of an aging vessel and a highly-paid and, by then, contracted-in crew. At the end of the day the original decision to sell Kawatiri was deferred for three years, but only to see if we could find new long-term and more importantly, financially sustainable, out-of-port work for it. We didn't. Dredging Greymouth, just 59 nautical miles south of Westport, topped up revenue for a short time, but the increasing costs of operating and maintaining the vessel were quickly going to exceed anything we might make from other ports much further away. Grey then built its own much smaller dredger, which seems to be doing the job pretty well. I feel sure in hindsight, that without that alluring promise of significant revenue from WMS, a decision to sell the dredge would have been back on the table in the first quarter of 2021. For these reasons I respectfully submit two items for consideration by Councillors at this LTP deliberation. 1. Defer the first three years of capital expenditure for further dredge refurbishment (\$1.83m) until year 2027-28. This gives us some security around the assumed long-term and new contract-based revenue coming to fruition. 2. Cap the ring-fenced account for the dredge. This way Council can help protect ratepayers. If things don't pan out as hoped, and we risk breaching the cap, then it can be revisited and brought back to Council for explanations to be given, and decisions to be made. Exclusive of the additional significant capital expenditure allocated to "dredge refurbishment" in this LTP, I calculated the dredge's debt cap right now should be approximately \$1.Sm. This is based on the following: 1. As at February 2025 we had dredge debt levels of \$958,500 (rounded) 2. The budget for the most recent slipping was reported by staff as \$444,000 so I rounded that up to \$450,000 (it could well be more which would impact the cap): New Total \$1,408,500 3. Deferred from the EAP last year was \$380,000 (for mechanical items). So assuming that goes ahead in the 25-26 financial year and is not increased: New Total \$1,788,500 4. We should expect to see a credit of the \$315,000 secured via RIF for the BELL and installation (which was in last year's EAP at \$307,000). Capped Total \$1,474,500 Rounded to \$1.5m The port itself, I have no major concerns about, other than the obvious risk if any assumed wharfage, berthage and pilotage revenue from WMS has been included in its budgets. Reducing the current port debt of approx. \$4m as at Feb 2025 should be the priority. Capital expenditure (outside of RIF funded projects) related to the port, should be kept to an absolute minimum given this is supposed to be a "barebones" budget. We have successfully operated a commercial fishing port here since 2017 without dredging the bar. We do need a Harbourmaster and we also need to keep sounding the bar for navigational safety, either using a local surveyor as Greymouth does, or the multi-beam hydrographic package aboard Protector - • whichever is the most cost effective. The Talleys wharf lease alone I would expect to see reducing current port debt significantly, to a point where we should be at least cost neutral in under a decade. If that isn't the case, then to our detriment, someone has taken a very uninformed view of the value of a commercial fishing wharf to Talleys. The floating basin requires some form of dredging quadrennially. This should be budgeted for and built into port user fees and fishing company wharf leases. It can easily be done with a backhoe dredger as has been used in Nelson for berth pockets for some years. There are a plethora of nationally-based smaller dredging companies that can complete this work for us effectively and efficiently. We don't need a 55m dredge with six crew to do this. Recreational boating is an area we have not explored much at all. There was recent surprise noted at the Council table when you were told we don't charge ramp fees. Further investigation of this, combined with the needs of the local yacht and boating club should be done. Ramp and trailer parking fees are a common source of revenue at other ports. Charter vessels such as those used for big-game fishing were always charged more for berths than the fishing fleet in my time. If that's not currently happening, and there are more of these types of vessels using the port, then it should be revisited. These commercial operators charge their customers highly and make very good money from charters out of Westport whilst using our new berths and their associated facilities. The Coates Street land should be sold. It is of no use to the port. It was valued recently at \$1,085,000. I feel we should now "stick to our knitting" with Westport Harbour, and that is the fishing industry. The "Toki" bridge doesn't have to be the "bridge to nowhere". Let's give it a real purpose. It can be the bridge to a thriving local fish market, pop up stores and restaurants - showcasing our wonderful kai moana products to the world - all from our

recently refurbished waterfront promenades. Thanks for the opportunity to submit to the DLTP.

1. The Reefton Care Trust Working Group is in the process of establishing a charitable trust (to be called Reefton Care Trust). The purpose of the trust will be to provide: a) health-related care and housing for seniors and others who may require supported living within the Inangahua Ward of the Buller District; and b) any other activities relating to the care of the elderly and those in need of supported living within the Inangahua Ward of the Buller District. 2. Following the sudden closure of Ziman House (part of the former Reefton Hospital) in 2022, under Covid lockdown, and consequent loss of the community and elder care support functions it provided, Reefton people have sought to work with Health New Zealand/Te Whatu Ora authorities in attempts to re-instate necessary services. 3. Despite repeated assurances over two years that Ziman House would reopen if nursing staff could be recruited, Health NZ officials delivered the decision in April 2024 that the facility was to be closed permanently. 4. As a consequence, the Inangahua community has lost its rest home, respite and palliative care services along with the hospital-level care formerly provided to our elders. 5. Closure of Ziman House has caused the loss of capacity for local residential care to enable our elderly folk to live near their friends and whanau. 6. In response to this situation, the Reefton Care Trust Working Group submits as follows: 7. We are a community whose demographic is aging, but facilities and resources for providing elderly care and assistance are dwindling. 8. Elder housing is a prime example of this. Instead of Buller District Council (BDC) growing its aged persons housing stock in Reefton as identified in its 2007 LTP for the 2014-15 year, from 16 to 18 units, BDC later postponed and then eliminated this expansion. Compounding this problem. BDC then removed two units from the portfolio, thus reducing the available stock to just 14 units, 9. In effect, BDC identified a growing need for aged person's housing, but then proceeded to reduce instead of increase the available housing stock. 10. The Reefton community has concluded that relying on outside controlled resourcing is no longer an option and we need to establish control over our own destiny. We have moved to establish Reefton Care Trust whose purpose is to provide health related care as well as housing for seniors and others who may require supported living within the Inangahua ward of the Buller District, and any other activities related to the care of elderly and those in need of supported living therein. 11. The Reefton Care Trust will liaise and work with community, Council and Government agencies to advance its purposes. 12. Buller District Council has been wrestling with elderly housing and its future direction since 2014, and has discussed disbursing the housing portfolio to outside providers. Reefton Care Trust would like to be part of this discussion and sees a potential opportunity to manage local housing stock within our Trust structure. 13. In conclusion, the Reefton Care Trust Working Group has three specific requests for inclusion in the 2025 LTP, as follow: • That Council opens an option to negotiate with Reefton Care Trust for the transfer of Reefton elderly housing stock. Allowing for this within the LTP will ensure opportunities are open and may reduce costs going forward, noting that there are funding advantages available by use of a community charitable trust model. • That the old WestReef yard is reserved in the interim while options for future use are explored by the Reefton Care Trust, and that potential transfer of the property to the Trust is provided for within the LTP. • That any monies from sale of the two old disused housing units and the now vacant previous BDC Service Centre and library premises be identified as elderly housing funds for the benefit of the Inangahua ward in accordance with the Inangahua Community Board's resolutions and the purposes of the intended Reefton Care Trust. 14. The Reefton Care Trust working group thanks Buller District Council for consideration of this submission. We look forward to working with Council toward better care of elderly and needy people in our community. We wish to be heard before Council in support of this submission.

For too long General rates have funded all stormwater activity meaning rural residents have paid by far the larger portion of this budget when the spending on stormwater is almost entirely related to town based activity. The problem that you now propose to remediate is specific to a limited number of identifiable individual town properties. To expect others to bear the majority of these costs takes no account of the fact that they have already met the cost of providing acceptable discharge of stormwater from their own properties. The sum of \$5.7million indicated for 611 properties equates to approximately \$9,300 per property. This would appear excessive. I am against the acceptance of the Draft document 2025-2034 LTP. I feel some areas need further clarification and debate. My concerns are based on the community participation and involvement in this process. I attended almost every drop in session and had reports from the three that I did not attend. I know what happened at every single one. I witnessed the numbers that attended and heard the conversations. It was evident that the community had issues with areas and topics other than those in the consultation document and on the prepared submission reply form. The full LTP plan did not seem to be getting much attention or scrutiny whatsoever. Many flicked through the Consultation document but once again seemed to have other areas of concern. Those that featured in the booklet were the Port, climate change adaptation, Carter's Beach stormwater, Stormwater in general, rates increases and Civil Defence. The Victoria Square trees were mentioned. Paul Reynolds and myself made up the numbers at most venues. Ones and twos became threes and fours. The sessions started slowly, at Epic, and with few exceptions never really picked up. I have the lists of staff and most of the public that attended each. Carter's Beach, Charleston, Little Wanganui and Karamea stood out as those that had good numbers. The majority of the meetings had just a handful of public turn-up. Sometimes we saw one or two and places like Maruia managed four. So for all the effort, and expense, of producing the two documents we can see reaction. Naturally we don't know how the online versions were accessed, or treated, but the content of the various submissions would be an indicator there. I was involved with the supermarket carpark awareness campaign and saw the effort Paul put in. Although I was only present for one afternoon I saw the public response. It was much the same as we have heard previously, they didn't understand why they should bother. Once again however, they did want to be involved. Most had not read the two documents or were interested in doing so. These were townsfolk that just wanted a council to do the right thing for the community, the ratepayers. The little form seemed to be about the right size. There needed to be a range of questions and topics. While only ticking the box is not an ideal way of doing a submission they did feel that they had contributed. They didn't seem to want to write more, even if they could. It was a simple pro-forma, much the same as the one BDC circulated with the consultation document. It was certainly an improvement on the tree survey and possibly even the 'moving the town' effort. I heard more community feedback while engaging the ratepayers in that environment than I did at most of the drop-in sessions. I am opposing the acceptance of the document on the grounds that I believe the process is flawed. We have hundreds of pages of planned activity that will basically proceed unless there is substantial opposition against any particular topic. Brougham House certainly stood out in that regard. The public seemed very much opposed to the planned expenditure. I saw the water as being a distraction, I will be speaking about the Harbour and climate change topics at the hearing. The Port financial statements do not tally with what is now known about the WMS and dredge situation. Perhaps even more strange is that they differ from the forecasting presented at the BDC meeting, 28 May 2025. I have attempted to address this issue by Letters to the Editor but the outcome was less than satisfactory. Is the LTP document fatally flawed ?



A suggestion was made that ratepayers instead receive information via the same system that rates bills are communicated to property owners. Brief notification with key points of BDC's jurisdiction for proposals and invitation to make submissions or to view draft document online. This in itself would help address the rumours circulating about financial incompetency of the current council with regard to financial management and disable the few individuals that propagate more distrust by spreading misinformation. I understand the pressure that the BDC is under concerning Central Government, however rushed processes only lead to higher risk of mistakes being made and further adds to the negative perceptions of BDC's management of finances and management in general

House's will be for sale everywhere and you might have a great infrastructure but just no people! For goodness sake think this through.

Respondents have self-selected to participate. Self-selecting respondents may have characteristics and opinions inconsistent with those of the general population.

In addition to this report ten supporting documents were supplied to councillors; these were outside the scope of this report.

## **1. Introduction**

As required under the Local Government Act 2002, Council must consult with the community before adopting a Long-Term Plan. The purpose of this consultation was to enable the public to participate in decision-making by providing feedback on key proposals, priorities, and planned activities for the next 9 years. Submissions provide an opportunity for individuals, organisations, and stakeholders to express their views, suggest changes, and contribute to shaping the final version of the Long-Term Plan 2025–2034.

This report summarises feedback received during consultation on the Draft Long-Term Plan (LTP) 2025–2034, which was open from 25 April to 26 May 2025. Each question has been aligned with the corresponding section of the attached submission forms.

Council invited feedback via the Council submission form, available online on Let's Talk Buller and in hard copy at five locations throughout the district. A total of 133 submissions were received: 78 online and 55 in hard copy, with some hard copies received via email. In total, 26 organisations submitted feedback via this method with supporting documents (Appendix A).

Additionally, 203 submissions were received using two different pro-forma submission forms (alternative forms) developed and circulated by a community group. These forms featured different wording and questions from the Council submission form and did not directly reference the content of the Draft Long-Term Plan.

In total, 336 submissions were received as part of the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025–2034 consultation. A breakdown is provided in Table 1.

The alternative forms used by a community group did not present or reference the content of the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025-2034 in the same way as Council's official submission form. It also used different wording and questions to collect feedback. As a result, submissions received through the Council form and the alternative form are treated as separate datasets, even though they address some of the same topics. The pro-forma (alternative) submissions have been analysed in the same way as the submissions submitted on the Council-created form or were provided in other individual formats. While analysed separately, they form part of the overall submission feedback discussed in this report.

Elected members must determine how much importance to assign to each set of submissions. This should be weighed alongside other relevant factors such as the impact on rates, levels of service, legislative requirements, and long-term financial sustainability.

## 2. Background

In February 2024, Council decided to defer the Long-Term Plan (LTP) 2024–2034, which was originally scheduled for adoption in June 2024. Instead, Council resolved to develop a 9-year Long-Term Plan in 2025 and adopted an Enhanced Annual Plan for the financial year 2024–2025.

This decision followed a joint announcement by Prime Minister Hon. Christopher Luxon and Minister of Local Government Hon. Simeon Brown on 13 February 2024, outlining upcoming changes in the local government sector. Key updates included the repeal of the existing water services legislation and the planned introduction of the Local Water Done Well framework.

Deferring the LTP gave the Council time to better understand and plan for the anticipated changes in water service delivery and governance, thereby helping to reduce uncertainty in long-term decision-making.

Between June 2024 and April 2025, Council developed the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025–2034. As required under the Local Government Act 2002, Council must consult with the community before adopting its Long-Term Plan. Public consultation took place from 25 April to 26 May 2025.

The Consultation Document was audited from Ernest and Young New Zealand who gave their opinion at the Extraordinary Council Meeting on 23 April.

Feedback collected during this period will inform the final Long-Term Plan, guiding Council's priorities, services, and investment decisions over the next nine years.

## 3. Legal obligations

In accordance with the Local Government Act 2002, Council is legally required to consult with the community before adopting a Long-Term Plan. This includes preparing a Consultation Document that must present key proposals, issues, and choices clearly and accessibly to support informed public participation.

As outlined in section 93C, the purpose of the Consultation Document is to:

- provide a fair and understandable summary of the matters proposed in the Long-Term Plan,
- explain significant and important issues and the choices available, and
- inform discussions between Council and its communities about the content of the plan.

To ensure these requirements are met, both the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025–2034 and the Consultation Document were independently audited prior to consultation. This audit confirms that the documents meet legislative standards and provide a sound basis for community engagement.

Although the Council's official submission form was designed to align with the content and structure of the Consultation Document, the alternative forms created by a community group did not adhere to this approach or reflect the full range of information required under the Act. Consequently, feedback received through the alternative form may not fully capture or engage with the key proposals presented by Council.

## 4. LTP submission form design

The primary method for collecting feedback was a submission form, available in both hard copy and online formats. It was structured to align with the flow of the Consultation Document, addressing key proposals from the Draft Long-Term Plan (LTP), including consultation topics, projects, Infrastructure and Financial Strategies, proposed rates, fees, and charges.

Each question in the form was linked to a specific section of the Consultation Document, guiding respondents through the content and encouraging them to provide informed responses. Additionally, questions were placed at the end of each section to prompt engagement at relevant points.

Only the submitter's name was required; all other fields were optional, enabling individuals to respond to the topics most relevant to them. The form featured two closed-ended (quantifiable) questions<sup>1</sup>, designed to capture straightforward preferences, and twelve open-ended (qualitative) questions<sup>2</sup>, aimed at gathering more detailed feedback on complex issues.

Respondents could also indicate whether they had read the Consultation Document, provide their contact details, request to speak at a hearing, and leave general comments on any other aspect of the Draft LTP. A breakdown of question types and related content is provided in Table 2.

## **5. Pro-forma form and comments**

The pro-forma (alternative) form created by the community group included one form with six closed-ended (quantifiable) questions, enabling respondents to express agreement or disagreement by selecting 'Yes' or "No' (Table 3). An additional form contained seven opinion statements, allowing people to comment (qualitative) (Table 4).

Note: Two questions on the alternative form (Table 4) were on climate change and planning a new town site, which were not addressed in the Council submission form or the Consultation Document.

Four questions aligned with topics also covered in Council's official submission form:

- whether Council should become a guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency (LGFA)
- the proposed replacement of Brougham House
- proposed rates
- the level of debt increase

However, the form created by Council took a different and more neutral approach. It included open-ended (qualitative) questions for feedback on Brougham House and proposed rates, presented contextual financial information before seeking input on

debt levels through its Financial Strategy section, and provided direct links to supporting material to encourage informed responses. In contrast, neither of the alternative pro-forma forms referenced the Consultation Document or linked to any background information. Consequently, the information based upon which those responses were formed is unclear.

Consequently, while some topics overlap, the feedback collected through the Council and alternative forms must be treated as two distinct data sets, due to significant differences in framing, content, and methodology.

## 6. Consultation communication

Council's communication and engagement strategy for the LTP 2025-2034 used a mixed-method approach to inform the community, clarify the consultation process, and encourage participation.

Clear, consistent messaging tailored to key elements of the Draft LTP—were delivered through a wide range of channels to ensure broad reach across the Buller community. These messages were supported by a visually appealing design aligned with Council's branding, clearly identifying the information as coming from Buller District Council.

From 5 March 2025, Council began sharing regular updates and key messages about the Long-Term Plan to build awareness ahead of the consultation period. This early-stage communication aimed to educate the community on the purpose, importance, and role of the Long-Term Plan and prepare them for meaningful participation.

The promotion of the consultation ran from March 5 to May 26, 2025, with messaging adapted across different phases to align with the communication and engagement plan. These phases are outlined in Figure 1.

Throughout the consultation period, all communication directed people to the submission form, the Consultation Document, the Draft Long-Term Plan, and other supporting materials. These were available online via Let's Talk Buller and in hard copy at Council offices, libraries, the Northern Buller Community Resource Centre, the Karamea Information Centre, and at drop-in sessions held across the district. We also gave the option for residents to meet with our Project Lead throughout.

The following communication channels used before and during consultation is:

### Traditional and community media

- Print media: Full-page advertisements in community newsletters
- Letterbox delivery: Two-page spread in The Messenger, circulated free to West Coast households and available at public locations
- Media articles: Media releases issued to local media outlets

- **Posters:** Displayed across the district
- **Radio:** Radio advertisements

### Digital communication

- Social media: Posts in local groups and on Council channels
- Website: Features on the Council website and Let's Talk Buller
- Email: Consultation banner added to all Council staff email footers

### Face-to-face and on-site engagement

- **Drop-in sessions:** Held throughout the district
- **Displays:** At Council offices, libraries, Northern Buller Community Resource Centre, and the Karamea Information Centre
- Internal: Information circulated to Councillors and Customer Services staff

To make the complex information in the Draft LTP more accessible, Council used a variety of formats to break down content into manageable and engaging components:

- Videos: Explaining key topics of the Draft LTP
- **Podcasts:** Providing in-depth explanations of key issues
- **Documents**: Including the Consultation Document and summary sheets
- Conversations: Via drop-in sessions and one-on-one discussions

All of this content was hosted on Let's Talk Buller, the central platform for consultation, which also provided access to detailed background information.

## 7. Consultation reach




Figure 2: Engagement funnel Draft Long-Term Plan 2025-2034

The Draft LTP page received 1,381 visits<sup>3</sup>. During the pre-consultation and consultation period between 5 March and 26 May 2025. A total of 1,150 visitors visited the page. Ninety visitors were engaged, 378 were informed, and 786 were aware of the information.<sup>4</sup> This yielded an engagement rate of 11,5%<sup>5</sup> (Figure 2).

Traffic to the page peaked towards the middle of the consultation period with a maximum of 62 visitors a day. During the entire period, the page received 3,445 page views.




Figure 3: Traffic through different channels to Draft LTP 2025-2034 project page 5 March – 26 May 2025

Most traffic to the page was through direct channels<sup>6</sup> like clicking on a link. These direct channels contributed to 634 aware visits, of which 252 (39.7%) were informed visits and 56 (8.8%) were engaged visits. Government sites, search engines, and social traffic channels<sup>7</sup> contributed significantly fewer aware visits but yielded a much higher percentage of informed visits and engaged visits (Figure 3).

This shows direct channels drive a significantly higher number of audiences to the project page, but traffic channelled through government sites, search engines, and social media yields a higher conversion rate (Table 5).

In total, 448 downloads were carried out between March 5 and May 26, 2025, from the project page from 311 unique visitors. The most downloaded document was the Draft Long-Term Plan, with 179 downloads, followed by the Draft LTP Consultation Document with 121 downloads, and the Draft LTP submission form with 44 downloads. The drop-in session dates were viewed 70 times by 44 visitors.

Social media posts on Council's Facebook and Instagram channels were actively used throughout the campaign. Posts were shared on both the Council's own pages and relevant Facebook community groups. In the final phase of the campaign, posts were customised to address the emerging information needs of the community.

Between 25 April and 26 May 2025, 13 Long-Term Plan posts were published across Facebook and Instagram—17% of all posts (77) during this period. These achieved a combined reach of 9,449, were viewed 14,542 times, with the link to the Let's Talk page clicked 908 times. The top-performing post was the "Why is Council using debt?" information video.

A detailed performance breakdown of all LTP-related posts during the consultation period, alongside other Council posts, is provided in Appendix B.

## 8. Data analysis methodology

Both quantitative and qualitative data were collected to provide meaningful insights into community feedback. These two data types are complementary:

- **Quantitative data** tells us what is happening by providing measurable, numerical information.
- **Qualitative data** explores the why, offering deeper insight into behaviours, beliefs, values, and constraints.

Together, they offer a more comprehensive perspective capturing both patterns and the underlying reason, facilitating informed conclusions and evidence-based recommendations.

## 1.1. Quantitative analysis

The quantitative analysis of closed-question responses focused on identifying patterns, trends, and relationships through statistical methods. This transformed raw numerical data into meaningful insights to support informed decision-making. The analysis was conducted using the built-in analytical tools within Buller District Council's engagement platform, Let's Talk Buller.

### 1.2. Qualitative analysis

The qualitative analysis of responses from open-ended questions and written feedback was conducted using thematic analysis, based on the framework developed by Braun and Clarke (2006). This structured approach identifies, analyses, and interprets patterns of meaning within textual data.

The process involved six key phases:

- 1. **Familiarisation with the data** Analysts reviewed the responses repeatedly to gain a deep understanding.
- 2. **Generating initial codes** Data was systematically coded and organised into meaningful segments.
- 3. **Searching for themes** Codes were grouped into potential themes and subthemes, revealing broader patterns.
- 4. **Reviewing themes** Themes were refined to ensure relevance, consistency, and representation of the data.

- 5. **Defining and naming themes** Each theme was clearly articulated and structured, including sub-themes where relevant.
- 6. **Identifying frequency** Frequency tables were developed to highlight the prevalence and significance of key themes.

**Note:** Some percentage totals may not equal 100% due to rounding or multi-select responses.

## 9. Data analysis

The consultation provided valuable feedback on key aspects of the Draft LTP. Submissions made using Council's official submission form or provided directly to Council are analysed in sections 9.1 to 9.8, while those received via the pro-forma form (alternative) are analysed separately in section 9.9. Where topics overlap, references to the pro-forma results have been included.

### 1.3. Cross-analysis of LTP submission form




Figure 4: Question 9 Have you read the Consultation Document or parts of it for the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025-2034. n<sup>g</sup>=108

Question 9, which asked whether submitters had read the Consultation Document or parts of it, received responses from 114 submitters. Of these, 97.4% (111) indicated they had done so. This suggests that the vast majority of respondents took the time to inform themselves before providing feedback on the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025–2034 (Figure 4).




Figure 5: Number of responses to questions on the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025-2034 submission form n=133

Figure 5 shows that the question that received the highest number of responses (92) was whether the Council should become a guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency. This was followed by the open-ended "other feedback" question (91 responses). The third most-answered question was the key consultation topic, asking respondents to select their preferred funding option for separating stormwater and wastewater in Westport, which received 84 responses. Notably, two of the three most-answered questions were closed-ended, reflecting high engagement with questions that required a clear position.

Table 6 shows that the open-ended questions with the highest response rates were:

- Other feedback (16.91%)
- Proposed rates (12.64%)

· Replacement of the Emergency Operations Centre and Brougham House buildings (10.22%)

This suggests that submitters placed particular importance on these topics. The high number of responses under "other feedback" also indicates that participants used this opportunity to raise a wide range of additional issues.

Across all twelve open-ended questions, a total of 538 individual responses varying in length and detail were received.

### **1.4 Westport's stormwater and wastewater separation**




Figure 6: Question 10 Please select your preferred option regarding Westport's wastewater and stormwater separation n=84

As part of the consultation for the Draft Long-Term Plan 2025-2034, Question 10 (Figure 6) sought feedback from the community regarding two viable options for funding the separation of Westport's' wastewater and stormwater systems.

Eighty-four submitters responded to this question. Of these, 82.1% (69) indicate a preference for the Council to proceed with the work and fund it through a targeted rate applied to properties in Westport and Carters Beach.

# 1.5 Question 11: Local Government Funding Agency guarantor

As part of the Draft LTP 2025–2034, Question 11 asked the community whether Council should become a guaranteeing local authority for the Local Government Funding Agency (LGFA) scheme.




Figure 7 3: Question 11 Please select your preferred option regarding Council becoming a guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency, n=92

Ninety-two submitters responded to this question, with 57 (62%) indicating that they did not support Council becoming an LGFA guarantor. This suggests that the majority of submitters oppose the proposal. The results are illustrated in Figure 7.

Among those who submitted using the alternative (pro-forma) form, opposition was higher: 97.9% (184) of these submitters expressed that they do not support Council's proposal to join the LGFA as a guarantor.

### 1.4. Key projects

Council asked the community for feedback on a range of key infrastructure projects. The analysis of this feedback is presented below:

### **Question 12 - Westport drinking water: Trunk Main Extension**

Twenty-seven submitters provided feedback on the proposed extension of the Westport trunk main. A key theme was support for a targeted rate funding model, with many submitters indicating that the cost should be borne by those directly benefiting from the service. This reflects a preference for a user-pays approach to infrastructure investment.




Figure 8: Question 12 Westport drinking water: Trunk Main Extension (Queen St-Alma Road Frequency of themes n=27

Several submitters expressed support for the project overall, noting the importance of resilient infrastructure and the need for continued investment in the district. However, some questioned whether the project aligns with Westport's long-term growth outlook. (Figure 8)

"If this is seen as essential then it needs to be done. However, I believe the thought is Westport's population will not increase significantly in the next decade. If this is the case, then I question whether it is required at present. This should be funded via targeted rates." – Respondent

No submissions received via the pro-forma (alternative) form included comments related to this topic.

# Question 13 - Westport drinking water: Re-establish the north branch/tunnel lining frequency of theme


Twenty-four submitters provided feedback on the proposal to re-establish the North Branch and undertake tunnel lining works. A total of 12 themes emerged, with the most common being support for the investment, the importance of a resilient water supply, and the need for continued investment in the district. This reflects a generally positive view of the project, with respondents recognising its value (figure 9).

Submitters proposed a range of funding options, with a targeted rate for affected areas mentioned most frequently (three responses). Alternative approaches, such as providing water tanks to impacted communities, were suggested twice.

*"We have to improve our infrastructure and not keep kicking the can down the road. Do it!!" – Respondent* 

No submissions received via the pro-forma (alternative) form included feedback related to this topic.

# Question 14 - Untreated drinking water supplies: Waimangaroa, Mokihinui, Little Wanganui


This question received 40 responses, from which 23 distinct themes were identified. The top six themes accounted for 50% of the total frequency, reflecting a combination of support for the proposed approach and suggestions to improve water quality in affected communities.

The most frequently mentioned suggestion—raised in nine comments—was to install water filters at individual households. The idea of providing water tanks for smaller communities was also common, appearing in five responses, often alongside the recommendation for household filters.

*"I think the idea of putting in tanks with UV filters at the houses is a good idea." – Respondent* 

Two of the six leading themes related to community involvement and a perceived lack of transparency. Respondents expressed a desire for Council to work more closely with local residents (eight mentions) and raised concerns about communication and the clarity of expenditure for ratepayers.

*" All land owners need to be made aware of what options and costs before going ahead with any works! – Respondent* 



These results are illustrated in Figure 10 and detailed in Appendix D. No submissions received via the pro-forma form included comments relevant to this topic.

## **Question 15 - Westport's wastewater: Riley Street Pump Station and network replacement**

Twenty-six submitters responded to this question, with the majority expressing clear support for the project and recognising its necessity. The top themes: support for the investment, the need to upgrade ageing infrastructure, and the importance of continued investment in the district, were mentioned 15 times, accounting for 52% of the cumulative frequency of all identified themes.

*"If it's going to improve drainage in Westport, go for it."-Respondent* 

Several submitters recommended funding the project through a targeted rate or a user-pays system, reinforcing the principle that those who benefit should contribute directly.

"Funded by targeted rates. If it's essential to do, yes—but it seems this may be an example of a poorly planned system in the past that now needs upgrading." – Respondent

In contrast, a small number of respondents suggested postponing the investment or seeking central government support, citing concerns about affordability. Each of these views was expressed once.

"When affordable without rates increase." - Respondent




Figure 11: Question 15 Westport's wastewater: Riley Street Pump Station and network replacement frequency of themes, n=26

Figure 11 displays the frequency of each theme and its share of the overall cumulative frequency. No feedback related to this topic was received through proforma submissions.

## **Question 16 - Property: Replacement Emergency Operation Centre and Brougham House Buildings**




Figure 12: Question 16 Property: Replacement Emergency Operation Centre and Brougham House Buildings frequency of themes, n=55

Fifty-five submitters responded to this question. Despite the relatively high number of responses, the range of themes was limited. The most common theme, cited by 17% (14) of respondents, was that the replacement is not a priority. This was closely followed by 16% (13) who felt that the existing buildings are sufficient (Figure 12).

#### "Definitely not required. Present building meets code requirements." -Respondent

A further 12% of submitters suggested that a less expensive option should be considered. Several concerns were raised by 7% (6 respondents) each, including that:

- funds should be reserved for more essential items
- the project is not a priority
- Council should avoid taking on more debt
- upgrading the existing buildings would be sufficient

"This is a ridiculous waste of ratepayer funds and is definitely NOT needed at this time when Council borrowings are already extremely high." - Respondent

In contrast, a smaller proportion of respondents expressed support.

- 6% (5) said a stable Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) and Brougham House are a priority
- 1% (1) supported the investment
- 1% (1) highlighted the importance of a positive working environment

4% (3) suggested that any upgrade should align with Westport's long-term planning

"I think serious consideration should be given to building an Emergency Operations Centre and, eventually, new purpose-built buildings for Council on the terraces on the South side of the Buller River. It would seem opportune, given the current climate projections, to build such important infrastructure well above the flood plain." – Respondent

Of the 192 submitters who used the pro-forma submission to comment on this topic, 99.5% expressed opposition to Council's replacement of Brougham House. The four written comments received through the pro-forma emphasised that the replacement is not seen as a priority, and that the existing building is considered adequate by these respondents.

# Question 17 - Rubbish management: Upgrade to the Westport and Reefton Transfer Stations




Figure 13: Question 17 Rubbish management: Upgrade to the Westport and Reefton Transfer Stations, frequency of themes and cumulative percentage, n=29

Twenty-nine submitters responded to this question, with 28% (11) expressing support for the proposed investment. However, 15% (6) of respondents emphasised the need to explore local solutions for waste management, rather than transporting rubbish to Nelson (figure 13).

"Rubbish should have been compacted years ago at transfer stations. I agree compaction of some sort is essential. It seems ridiculous to transport Buller's rubbish to Nelson. Should we not be revisiting other options? Are we getting fair transport charges to Nelson?" – Respondent

8% (3) highlighted the importance of continued waste minimisation efforts, while 10% (4) supported the idea of a recycling shop to enhance sustainable rubbish management and community engagement.

"Definitely much needed. Would like to see the Green Waste project extended. Would like to have a recycling shop/area on site similar to many other towns. This would help with community engagement with recycling and rubbish management." – Respondent

In contrast, four submitters opposed the project outright, and three suggested it should be funded using a user-pays approach.

No feedback related to this topic was received through the pro-forma submissions.

#### **Question 18 - Wastewater and stormwater separation**

Fifty-two submitters responded to this question, using it as an opportunity to expand on or justify their preferred funding option for separating wastewater and stormwater in Westport—first introduced earlier in the submission form. Many also proposed alternative funding models or approaches to achieve a compliant stormwater system.

The most frequently mentioned theme, cited by 14 submitters (27%), was support for funding the work through a targeted rate.

"This to be funded via targeted rates. The property owner directly affected needs to be consulted." - Respondent

Nine submitters (15%) supported the project on the grounds that the infrastructure requires upgrading. Seven submitters proposed that only individual property owners who still need to separate their stormwater and wastewater systems should bear the cost, rather than applying a targeted rate to everyone.

"Many homes have already undertaken separation, and the homes that have not should bear the cost. To apply a targeted rate to all properties in Westport and Carters Beach would mean those who have already paid would be paying twice." – Respondent

Six contributors recommended using the Uniform Annual General Charge (UAGC) as an alternative funding mechanism, differing from both options outlined in the Consultation Document.

"If stormwater is to be separated in Westport, and then Reefton in the future, and paid for by all general ratepayers, then payment should be through the UAGC rather than general rates based on land value." - Respondent

Only two submitters explicitly supported funding the work through the general rate, as proposed in the Draft Long-Term Plan Consultation Document.




Figure 14: Question 18 Wastewater and stormwater separation, frequency of themes and cumulative percentage, n=52

The distribution of themes and their relative frequencies is presented in Figure 14. Themes that relate to the proposed options or suggested funding options are highlighted in Figure 14.

Aside from funding-related comments, several submitters raised additional themes. Among these were the significance of involving affected property owners and concerns regarding whether the project should proceed at all.

"The two options do not make sense to me as Carters Beach does not have a proper stormwater system. So what exactly is Council planning to do? Stormwater from our property does not enter the sewerage system; therefore, we refuse to pay for a non-existent service." - Respondent

Other submitters used this question to express strong support for the project and highlighted why they view separation as a critical investment.

"Vitally important improvement strategy. Fully support. Required to achieve regulatory compliance, avoid abatement notices and fines, and maintain strategic relationships with regional council and mana whenua." - Respondent

Of the four pro-forma submission forms that included comments on this topic, two indicated uncertainty about the scope of the project, and one objected to the costs being shared with residents of Carters Beach or rural properties.

#### **1.5.** Question 19- Infrastructure Strategy

Thirty-eight submitters provided comments on the Infrastructure Strategy, which was summarised in the Consultation Document and made available in full alongside the Draft Long-Term Plan and the supporting Asset Management Plans. A full list of themes and their frequencies is provided in Appendix E.

This question prompted a wide range of responses, resulting in 30 distinct themes, spanning high-level strategic suggestions to requests for specific infrastructure improvements.

The most frequently mentioned theme (6 mentions) was that funding should be directed only toward essential infrastructure. This was followed by support for the Infrastructure Strategy (5 mentions) and the view that efficiency should be prioritised (4 mentions).

"Spend the money on basic needs. The separation and water improvement." – Respondent

Three respondents each raised the need to align upgrades with Westport's longterm plans and to ensure continued investment in the district.

"Coastal wetlands and tidal zones facing more regular inundation—this should be considered in any new and existing infrastructure. What can be done as the environmental zones change? Can we see projects involving the community to support ecology, environment, and people?" -Respondent

A number of submitters commented on how the strategy should be funded. Suggestions included:

- deferring investment until it can be delivered without a rates increase (1)
- avoiding additional debt (1)
- staggering expenditure over time (1) matching costs to existing income streams (1)

These views were connected by a recurring call for an affordable infrastructure strategy, mentioned three times.

"Clearly carefully considered and presented – yet high ongoing costs to ratepayers ahead if borrowing continues. Please monitor and minimise borrowing where and when possible." - Respondent

No feedback relevant to this topic was received through the pro-forma submissions.

#### 1.6. Question 20 - Proposed rates




Figure 15: Question 20 Do you have any feedback on our proposed rates? Frequency of themes and cumulative percentage n=68

Sixty-eight comments were received in response to this question, from which 30 distinct themes emerged (Figure 15). The top six themes reflected a range of concerns regarding the impact of current and future rate increases and together accounted for 51% of the total cumulative frequency.

These key themes included:

- the need to keep rates affordable
- aligning rates with inflation
- · rates being unaffordable for certain groups
- increased rates causing financial hardship and social strain
- rate increases prompting people to move
- · limited discretionary spending due to rising rates

The most frequently mentioned theme was a strong concern about affordability, often supported with personal context or suggestions to tie rate increases to inflation. The idea of aligning future rate rises with inflation was mentioned 13 times.

"Not affordable. Sadly, will probably sell up and leave. Only problem is who's gonna buy it with rates this high?" - Respondent

These top themes clearly convey the financial pressure felt by many submitters, either currently or anticipated under the proposed Long-Term Plan. The second most cited theme aligning rate increases with inflation was often positioned as a practical solution to ease community burden. These findings are illustrated in Figure 15 and detailed in Appendix C.

"Already high for the services received, and any increase is too much for an already very low-income population!" - Respondent

Exploring the remaining 24 themes, respondents proposed a variety of mechanisms to keep rates low. These included reducing overall spending, cutting unnecessary operational costs, aligning expenses with income, collaborating with other West Coast councils, and seeking greater central government support.

"There seems to be a local growing consensus that rate rises, for whatever reasons, have gone too far and that a thorough review of BDC spending is needed to reduce rates and determine a more affordable

and efficient way forward. Those we have spoken to overwhelmingly prefer lower rates over more services, and it stands to reason that local resentment will only increase as more people feel that they are being impoverished by excess Council spending." – Respondent

In addition to financial strategies, respondents highlighted more nuanced concerns, including the small ratepayer base, previous high rate increases, rising cost of living, and the impact on elderly residents, for whom rate increases were seen as particularly unaffordable.

*"All rates should be capped to the rate of inflation! Ratepayers, especially the elderly, don't have the ability to afford an ever-increasing percentage of their minimal income to cover increased rates along with the increased power and food costs. Put yourselves in their shoes! If you rate people out of the area, then there goes your income stream!" - Respondent* 

Conversely, a smaller group of respondents acknowledged that rate increases are unavoidable, recognising the need to invest in infrastructure after periods of underinvestment.

"Well done Council for keeping it as low as you have, despite having to deal with years of underinvestment from a shameful period when there were no rate rises or forward thinking." - Respondent

Among the 197 pro-forma submitters who commented on this topic, 100% opposed any increase above the rate of inflation. This closely mirrors the position of approximately 9% of submitters using the Council-created form.

The four written comments included in the pro-forma submissions reinforced this stance, strongly emphasising that affordable rates must remain a priority and that increases should not exceed inflation.

#### 1.7. Question 21 - Financial Strategy




Figure 16: Question 21 Do you have any feedback on our Financial Strategy? Frequency of themes n=45

Forty-five submitters responded to this question, with 14 strongly objecting to Council taking on additional debt, making this the most frequently mentioned theme. Several respondents directly linked this concern to their opposition to Council becoming a guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency (LGFA). The frequency of each theme is illustrated in Figure 16.

"I am against the Council becoming a guarantor and thereby placing Buller ratepayers at risk of even more rate increases. You should be focused on living within the rating take, not looking for ways to access more borrowing." - Respondent

Submitters also proposed alternative ways for Council to manage its finances without incurring further debt. The most common suggestions included:

- spending only on essential items (7 mentions)
- matching expenses with income (4 mentions)
- cutting unnecessary operational costs (4 mentions)

"The strategy is good; it's what feeds into it that makes the dollars and cents add up.

Stop spending on ridiculous one-off projects that benefit one or two, and start focusing on the big issues. Get more efficient and stop wasting money and time on large issues that just need to be fixed." -Respondent

Eight additional submitters raised concerns regarding the lack of transparency in how funds are spent, while four commented on perceived incompetence in financial management.

"Ridiculous money wastage by Council with a complete lack of accountability."- Respondent

Among the 194 pro-forma submitters who commented on this topic, 99.5% opposed any increase in Council debt. The four written pro-forma comments echoed this strong objection, emphasising that debt should not be increased under any circumstances.

#### **1.8.** Question 22 - Fees and charges


Forty-three submitters provided feedback on Council's fees and charges, although many extended their comments to cover broader financial concerns. The most frequently discussed issue was rubbish disposal fees, with six submitters calling for these to be reduced.

*"Keep rubbish disposal affordable. Fly dumping will only increase as disposal fees increase."- Respondent* 

The second most common theme, expressed by five submitters, was that Council's fees and charges are generally too high. The third and fourth most frequent themes highlighted suggestions for minimising fees and charges, including cutting unnecessary operational costs and maintaining a focus on minimal spending to reduce the overall financial burden on ratepayers.

"Same too many management staff costing the ratepayers plenty." – Respondent

Beyond these main themes, submitters raised a variety of additional points, often at lower frequency. These included comments on specific charges (e.g. library fees and consent charges) as well as broader concerns, such as calls for greater central government support.

#### 1.9. Question 23 - Other feedback

Ninety-one comments were received in response to this question, generating a wide range of feedback. From these, 65 distinct themes were identified, many of which emerged in clusters of related ideas.

Two key issues emerged most frequently. The first was a request for a community facility in Punakaiki (9 mentions), which was linked with themes such as community hub, community wellbeing, the need for a facility in Punakaiki, the value of community facilities, and the importance of Council support for such amenities.

The second major issue was the ongoing concern and uncertainty regarding the rating of the Ngakawau-Hector Water Supply, mentioned 11 times. Submitters expressed strong opposition to the proposed rate increases and questioned Council's authority under the Water Services Act.

"The Buller District Council has written in their booklet that the Ngakawau-Hector water supply water rate will rise in the year 2027– 2028 from \$357 to \$1,614.55. The BDC has no authority to raise the Ngakawau-Hector water rate as they are neither the owner nor the registered water supplier for the water supply. We have been the registered water supplier since 1994. The BDC are breaching the Water Services Act by doing this." – Respondent

The theme of community wellbeing appeared frequently, often in alongside related topics such as community hubs, facilities, projects, and the expectation that Council should support these community spaces.

"The Carters Beach Reserve and Hall Subcommittee would like to thank Buller District Council for continuing to include wellbeing in the LTP, despite wellbeing being removed from local government requirements in 2024. Thank you for the essential services you provide to Kawatiri, including the swimming pool, gym, parks and reserves, library, community grants, airport and NBS cinema. Without BDC supporting wellbeing, Kawatiri would be a much diminished area."- Respondent

Another recurring theme was the concern about rising Council debt, highlighted by several submitters. In three instances, this concern was specifically associated with port-related borrowing.

*"I have major concerns relating to the debt incurred by Buller Port. I believe that this potential debt will be another major cost to Buller ratepayers in the future."- Respondent* 

A full list of identified themes and their frequency is provided in Appendix F.

#### 1.10. Pro-forma submissions

A total of 203 pro-forma (alternative) submissions were received, using two different forms created, distributed, and collected by an external community group.

Submitters using the pro-forma expressed consistent and unified opposition to several key proposals in the Draft Long-Term Plan. These included Council:

- becoming a guarantor of the Local Government Funding Agency (LGFA)
- increasing debt
- raising rates above the rate of inflation
- allocating funding to planning a new town site or addressing climate change




Figure 18: Pro-forma questions with number of responses n=199

These responses relate to the closed-ended questions in the pro-forma Figure 18.

Alongside the closed-ended responses, a small number of submitters also provided answers to four open-ended questions in a separate pro-forma. These questions can be found in Table 4:

Four submitters commented on continued spending on "Resilience" for a new town site. Three strongly opposed any such spending, while one suggested that upgrading the stormwater system should be prioritised.

Four submitters commented on climate change, with three expressing strong opposition to any related expenditure.

One submitter used the pro-forma form to raise broader concerns, urging Council to reduce unnecessary spending and adopt a more reactive, needs-based approach.






### Appendix C: Frequency of themes for proposed rates (n=68)


# **Appendix D**: Frequency of themes for untreated water supplies (n=40)
