# What we are consulting on

Following community feedback, Council made changes to the proposed Keeping of Animals Bylaw 2022 after the public consultation in September/October 2022

Between 3 July and 31 July 2023 Council is consulting on these changes to the proposed Keeping of Animals Bylaw 2022.

Hearings will be held in August – September with a decision expected to be made by October.

Bylaws are discrete pieces of law created by councils that specifically apply to a district. These locally applicable forms of legislation deal with district-specific issues that are not already covered by any existing Acts of Parliament or Regulation.

### These are the changes proposed:

Re-definition of urban areas:

Only Westport, Carters Beach and Reefton are now proposed to be considered as urban areas

#### Keeping of cats in urban areas:

- reducing the number to 2 per property; and
- requiring all cats over 6 months old to be desexed, microchipped and registered with Companion Animals New Zealand.

The remainder of the proposed bylaw remains the same as the one which was consulted on in 2022.

Please take the time to read the Statement of Proposal. By doing this you bring your voice to the discussion on how animals are kept and managed in Buller, particularly for those who own cats and those who live in urban areas.
