Accordingly the application can be determined on the papers.

**Application**

This is an application by Westport Rugby Club (the licensee) for a Special Licence pursuant to Section 138 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 13a Derby Street, Westport, and known as Westport Trotting Club Tea Rooms.

This application is to enable alcohol to be sold at the following occasion/s or event/s Golden Oldies Rugby Aftermatch.

The applicant seeks the following days and hours of operation: 11 March 2023 3:00pm till 11:00pm.

The applicant has provided host responsibility and staffing details that demonstrate suitable measures are in place to ensure the responsible sale and supply of alcohol and that any potential opportunity for harm will be minimised.

The designation for the premises during the event is:

**Supervised:** Any person under 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and as such the premises are deemed to be designated as supervised.

**Reasons for the Decision**

- The Licensing Inspector has provided a favourable report and has raised no opposition. The Inspector has also indicated that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.
- The NZ Police has raised no matters in opposition to this application.
- The Medical Officer of Health has raised no matters in opposition to this application.
- The application was not required to be publicly notified.
- The applicant has demonstrated that the manner in which they sell, supply, display and promote alcohol complies with the Act.
- The applicant has previously been granted special licences for events and there have been no adverse reports received.
- There is nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate the applicant is not suitable to be the holder of a licence.

In summary, the application and supporting information satisfies all the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.



## **Decision**

I have considered all the papers put before me and I am satisfied that the application meets all the requirements of the criteria of s.142 of the Act and the applicant will be able to safely and responsibly supply and sell alcohol in a manner that will ensure that any harm caused by the inappropriate or excessive consumption of alcohol will be minimised.

I therefore grant the application by Westport Rugby Club (the licensee) and authorise the issue of a special licence subject to the terms and conditions noted below as forming part of this decision.

The licence may issue immediately.

### **Conditions to be imposed:**

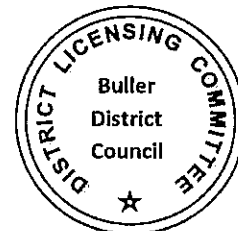
- (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied only on the following days and hours:  
11 March 2023 3:00pm till 11:00pm.
- (b) Free potable drinking water must be available on the premises for the duration of the licence.
- (c) Alcohol may be sold in the following types of containers only: Glass and Plastic Cups.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
  - (i) Food must be available at reasonable prices for consumption for the duration of the event.
  - (ii) The licensee must have available for consumption, at all times when alcohol is being sold or supplied, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low alcohol refreshments.
  - (iii) Transport options signage must be displayed. A phone must also be available on site to contact an alternative form of transport if required.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
  - (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age.
  - (ii) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
  - (iii) Any intoxicated persons may not enter or remain on the premises.
- (f) A copy of the licence and conditions must be displayed in a prominent place so as to be easily read by persons entering through the principal entrances.
- (g) The following parts of the premises are designated as:  
**Supervised:** The entire premises. Any person under 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and as such the premises are deemed to be designated as supervised.
- (h) The managers appointed for the purpose of this licence are to be Stephen Crackett and Marc Crackett. A sign must be displayed identifying the duty manager.

The functions, powers and duties of the District Licensing Committee is delegated to the committee chairperson under section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) when no objection has been filed, and no matters of opposition have been raised by the Police, Medical Officer of Health or the Inspector in respect of an application for a licence.

**Decision**

Club Buller Incorporated is applying for a special licence to allow for the sale and supply of alcohol on 10 March 2023 at a funeral/reception which will allow non-members of the Club to be served alcohol. The applicant is seeking operating hours of 3:00pm till 6:00pm.

The applicant is the holder of a current Club licence and has been granted special licences on a number of occasions. There have been no adverse reports received about any of these events. There is also nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that the applicant is not suitable to be the holder of a special licence.

West Coast Police and Medical Officer of Health have mutually agreed in principle to not raise any matters in opposition to the granting of applications for special licences for a funeral or funeral reception when it is to be held at a Workingmens Club or RSA. As such I am able to consider the application on the papers put before me.

A club only requires a special licence for these events to allow persons who are not members of the Club to be able to purchase and consume alcohol and it is acknowledged that it is likely that the deceased person, or the family of that person, are members of the Club and that any other persons are attending as their guests.

Low and non-alcoholic drinks and free drinking water will be available on the premises. Catering will be provided by the Club.

The layout of the premises will not materially alter during the holding of this event and therefore the design and layout of the premises is considered adequate and given the short duration of the event it is not expected that the amenity or good order of the neighbourhood will be affected in more than a minor way.

The applicant has nominated William McDermott and Evan Fox as manager/s for the event and they are the holders of current manager's certificates. All other staff are aware of their responsibilities to monitor patron's behaviour and ensure that the requirements of the Act are being met. All staff will ensure that ID is requested from those who look under 25 years of age and no alcohol will be sold to minors or to intoxicated persons. Intoxicated patrons will not be allowed to remain on the premises and disorderly behaviour will not be tolerated.

I am satisfied that the application meets the required criteria as set out in s.142 of the Act and that the applicant will ensure that the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol will be undertaken safely



and responsibly and that any harm that may be caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol will be minimised. Therefore, this application from Club Buller Incorporated for a special licence is granted subject to conditions.

As applications for special licences for funerals/funeral receptions are unable to be made within the required 20 working day timeframe under the Act, a waiver under section 208 of the Act is hereby also granted.
