Decision

<u>Club Buller Incorporated</u> is applying for a special licence to allow for the sale and supply of alcohol on 25 March 2024 at a funeral/reception for Janet Scanlon which will allow non-members of the Club to be served alcohol. The applicant is seeking operating hours of 3:00pm to 8:30pm.

The applicant is the holder of a current Club licence and has been granted special licences on a number of occasions. There have been no adverse reports received about any of these events. There is also nothing in the papers put before me that would indicate that the applicant is not suitable to be the holder of a special licence.

West Coast Police and Medical Officer of Health have mutually agreed in principle to not raise any matters in opposition to the granting of applications for special licences for a funeral or funeral reception when it is to be held at a Workingmens Club or RSA. As such I am able to consider the application on the papers put before me.

A club only requires a special licence for these events to allow persons who are not members of the Club to be able to purchase and consume alcohol and it is acknowledged that it is likely that the deceased person, or the family of that person, are members of the Club and that any other persons are attending as their guests.

Low and non-alcoholic drinks and free drinking water will be available on the premises. Catering will be provided by the Club.

The layout of the premises will not materially alter during the holding of this event and therefore the design and layout of the premises is considered adequate and given the short duration of the event it is not expected that the amenity or good order of the neighbourhood will be affected in more than a minor way.

The applicant has nominated Evan Fox, Shelly Corbett and William McDermott as managers for the event and they are the holders of current manager's certificates. All other staff are aware of their responsibilities to monitor patron's behaviour and ensure that the requirements of the Act are being met. All staff will ensure that ID is requested from those who look under 25 years of age and

no alcohol will be sold to minors or to intoxicated persons. Intoxicated patrons will not be allowed to remain on the premises and disorderly behaviour will not be tolerated.

I am satisfied that the application meets the required criteria as set out in s.142 of the Act and that the applicant will ensure that the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol will be undertaken safely and responsibly and that any harm that may be caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol will be minimised. Therefore, this application from <u>Club Buller Incorporated</u> for a special licence is granted subject to conditions.

As applications for special licences for funerals/funeral receptions are unable to be made within the required 20 working day timeframe under the Act, a waiver under section 208 of the Act is hereby also granted.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied only on the following days and hours:
 - Monday 25 March 2024 3:00pm till 8:30pm.
- (b) Free potable drinking must be available for the duration of the licence on request from the bar, or by way of self service from jugs on the bar.
- (c) Alcohol may be sold in the following types of containers only: Glass vessels, cans.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - Food must be available for consumption for the duration of the licence.
 - (ii) The licensee must have available for consumption, at all times when alcohol is being sold or supplied, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low alcohol refreshments.
 - (iii) Transport options signage must be displayed. A phone must also be available on site to contact an alternative form of transport if required. Courtesy transport is also to be available.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) ID is to be requested from any person who looks under 25 years of age.
 - (ii) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
 - (iii) Any intoxicated persons may not enter or remain on the premises.
- (f) The designations of the existing Club Licence apply.
- (g) The qualified manager/s appointed for the purpose of this licence are to be Evan Fox, Shelly Corbett and William McDermott. A sign must be displayed identifying the duty managers.
