

# Library 'Night Mode' popular with youth

Staff at the Sue Thomson Casey Memorial Library in Westport have been exploring ways to better support young adults in our communities.

As a smaller rural library, we need to be considerate and strategic about delivering programs that meet community needs while working within our team's capacity and budget. To ensure our approach aligns with what young people want and need, we engaged with high school students, Tai Poutini Polytechnic, and Youth Voice Kawatiri to design a programme that works for them.

One of our recent, successful initiatives is Night Mode — a dedicated late-night library session for youth, offering study spaces and social activities like games, and soon-to-be Dungeons & Dragons. While navigating challenges such as avoiding conflicts with other local events, we've used these evenings to engage directly with young library users

In the next few months, we hope to engage with youth in Reefton to help us create activities for them, based on their needs. This will be facilitated by Buller District Libraries in Reefton.

Feedback from Kawatiri youth has been invaluable, and as a result, we're now developing a larger, dedicated Young Adult (YA) area at the library. This space will house the YA collection alongside study and social areas tailored to the needs of our young people.

## 2025 Local body elections

Every three years, elections are held across New Zealand to elect mayors, councillors and community boards across the motu. This is a chance to make your voice heard and have your say in the future of the Buller District.

The next local body elections will be held in October 2025. Election day is Saturday 11 October, and voting will take place between 9 September - 11 October.

Have you thought about standing for the Buller District? If elected, you could play a crucial role in our district's future through the decisions you help make over the following three years.

Any New Zealand citizen over the age of 18 who is enrolled on the parliamentary roll can stand for election and our community needs representatives from all backgrounds and walks of life. Will you answer the call and make a difference in Buller?

#### Key dates for the 2025 local elections:

Friday 4 July	Nominations open. Electoral roll opens for inspection.
Friday 1 August	Nominations close at 12 noon. Electoral roll closes.
By 6 August	Public notice of candidate names and special voting places.
9 - 22 September	Delivery of voting documents (will occur between these dates).
9 September - 11 October	Voting and special voting period. Early processing period.
Saturday 11 October	Election Day (voting closes at 12 noon) Progress / preliminary results will be announced as soon as practicable.
11 - 16 October	Official count and processing of special votes.
16 - 19 October	Declaration of final result and public notice of results.

#### **Enrolment**

If you are already enrolled as a parliamentary elector, you will automatically be placed on Council's electoral roll. If you need to enrol or update your name or address details, you can:

- Visit vote.nz and use your New Zealand driver licence, New Zealand passport or RealMe verified identity to enrol online
- Free call 0800 36 76 56 and ask for a form to be sent to you

If you'd like help with the enrolment forms or checking your details online, please call in to one of our service centres, where staff are available to assist.

## Water supplies

Council would like to remind consumers to flush their taps by letting about a mugful of water run through in the morning, prior to use.

This applies to all supplies including rainwater. Visit Council's website 'water plumbosolvency' for details. There are different levels of water treatment in Buller.

The Cape Foulwind water supply (Wilsons Lead Road and Bulls Rd) is for stock use only and is not intended for human consumption.

A permanent boil water notice applies for Little Wanganui Subdivision, Mōkihinui, Ngakawau/ Hector, South Granity and Waimangaroa.

#### Wastewater

Council operates sewerage treatment plants in Little Wanganui, Reefton and Westport.

Please don't flush any wipes, including those labelled as flushable, or paper towels into the toilet.

People who have a connection to the Orowaiti sewerage scheme are reminded that they should no longer be using septic tanks and should be connected to the reticulation.

#### **Stormwater**

Please consider stormwater and wastewater separation. Stormwater that enters the sewer must be treated as sewage. This can cause sewer capacity problems during prolonged and heavy rain.

The majority of the stormwater is discharged untreated into the district's rivers. Please consider this when discharging fluids into the stormwater system. If you wouldn't want to swim in it, it shouldn't be going into the stormwater and needs to be disposed of as wastewater.
