We refer to your official information request dated 17 May 2023 for information related to climate change and impacts on the Buller District Council.

The information you have requested is provided via links to the information and marked in blue below. We hope this assists with your assignment.

Level 3 NCEA Assessment

Myself and two other year students at Buller High School have an NCEA assessment in which we investigate the idea of Climate Change and its impacts on the Buller district.

We were wondering if you might be able to answer any of the following questions we have about the topic.

The transition will impact jobs, such as creating well-paying jobs in new

industries and a need to re-train people for low-emissions jobs.

- What are the employment opportunities for mitigating climate change?
 Same as above
- How have the floods affected the Buller District's economy so far?

- Do you believe climate change will significantly impact the Buller district's financial growth?
- Is the Buller District facing hazards from climate change?
 Yes, as is the rest of New Zealand.
- Has climate change affected the infrastructure of Westport?
 Yes examples included our waste and storm water network from the floods in July 2021; damage to the Westport Water supply intake, and our roading network from the storm event of February 2022. There was also significant damage to the Westport Wharf.
- What actions are being taken to maintain the infrastructure of Westport?

A significant Return to Service (RTS) Programme of repairs funded by Council, NEMA, Cabinet and Waka Kotahi.

- How has the recent floods impacted the infrastructure?
 Aside from the Roading impact damage costs (\$13.2M + \$3.05M)
 \$17.1m costs for the infrastructure repair programme of 3 Waters,
 Westport Wharf, Tiphead revetment and Reefton historic landfill.
- What financial costs are the Buller District Council facing to maintain infrastructure?

This will be presented to Council as part of the 2024-2034 LTP (Long Term Planning).

LGNZ provide Councils with advice on future inflation trends. As I understand, these have not been provided to date. NZ Treasury - more recent indicators show inflation is likely to reduce in the short to medium term.
